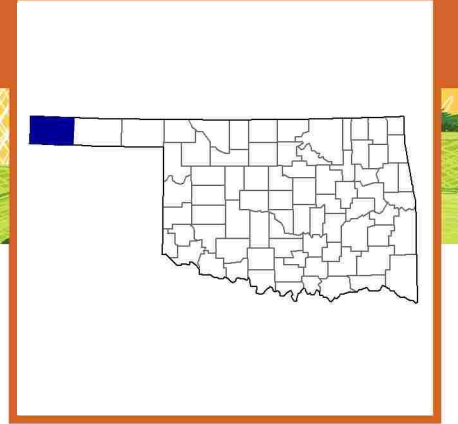


Cimarron County, Oklahoma Farms with American Indian or Alaska Native Producers^a

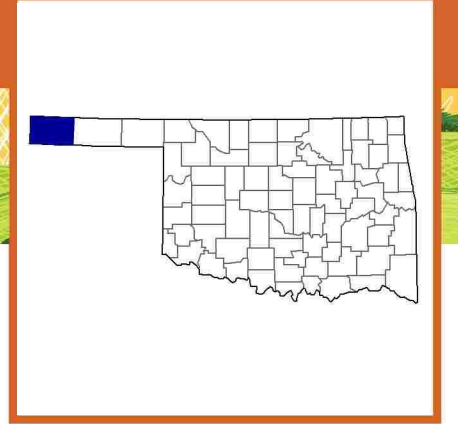

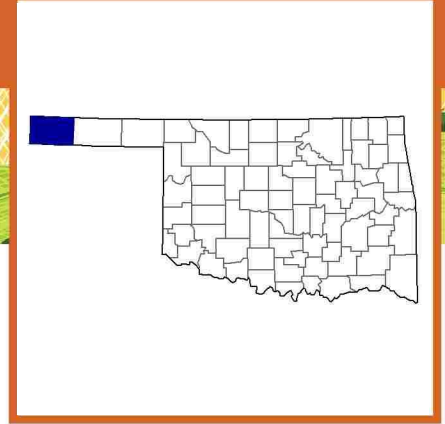

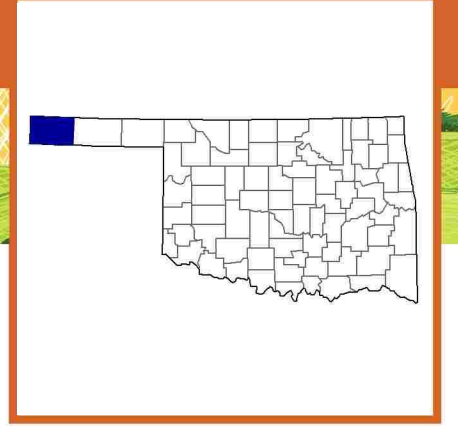

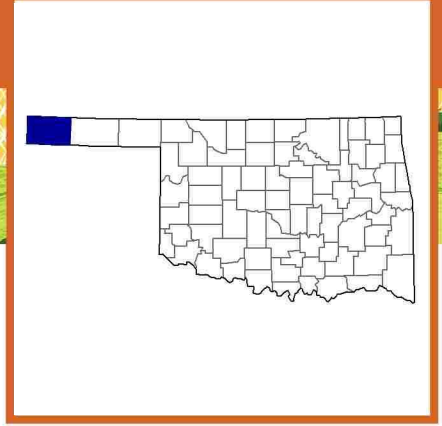

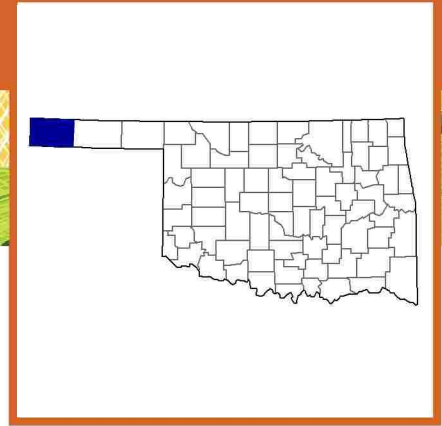
