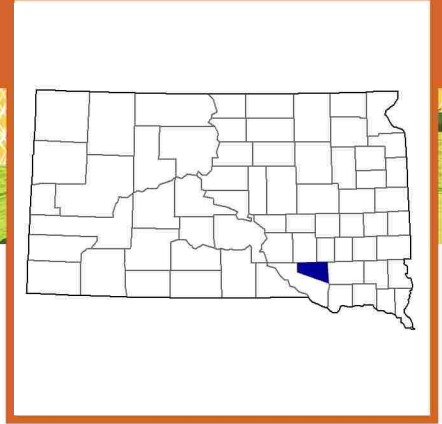

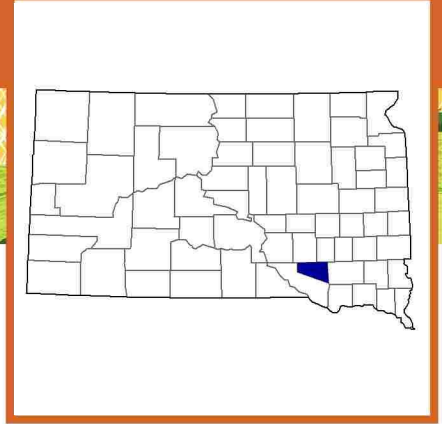


## Douglas County, South Dakota Farms with Asian Producers<sup>a</sup>

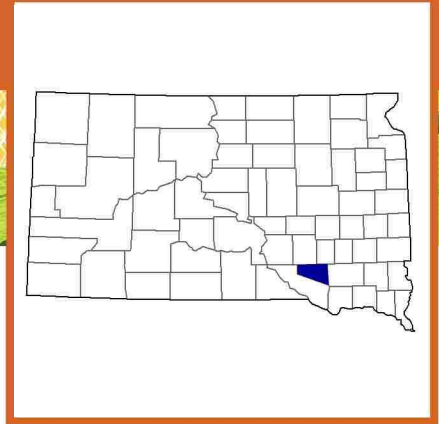

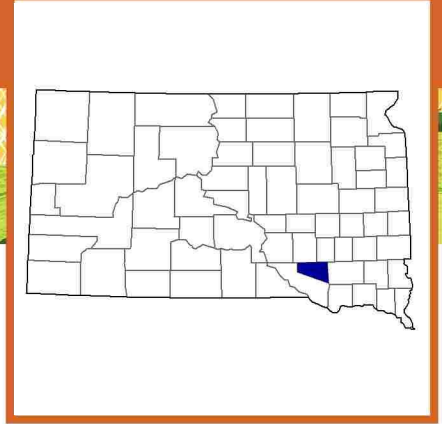

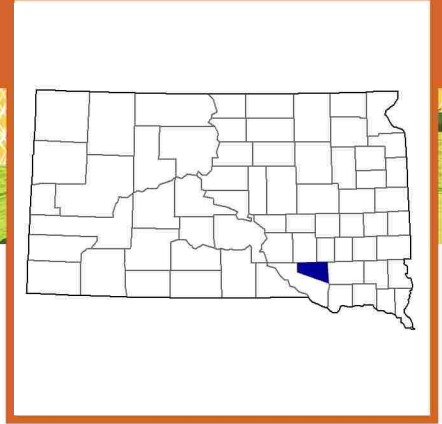

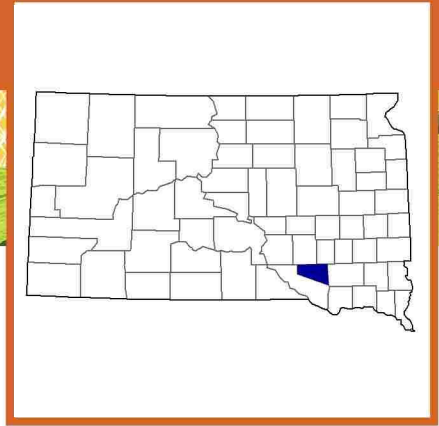
