

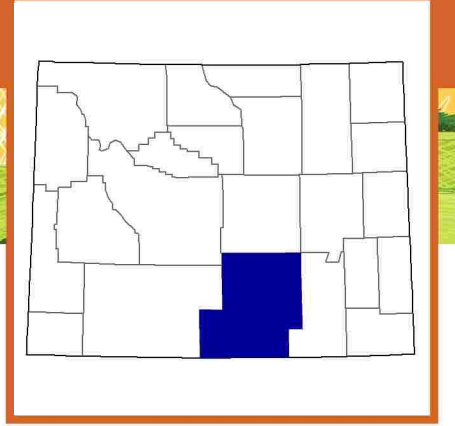

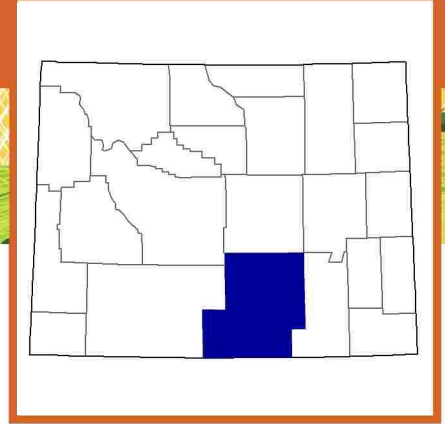


Carbon County, Wyoming Farms with Asian Producers^a

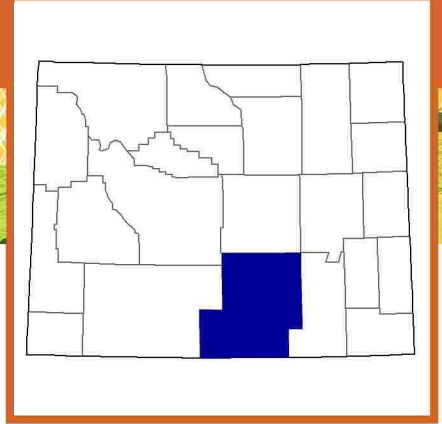

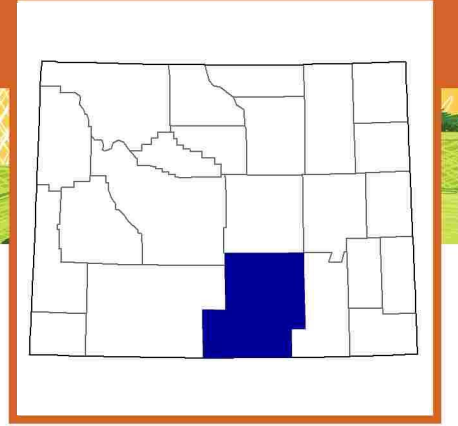

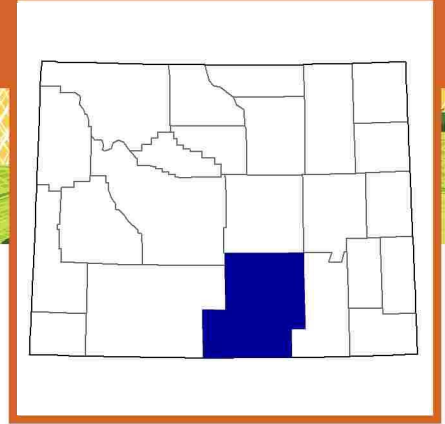


Carbon County, Wyoming Farms with White Producers^a



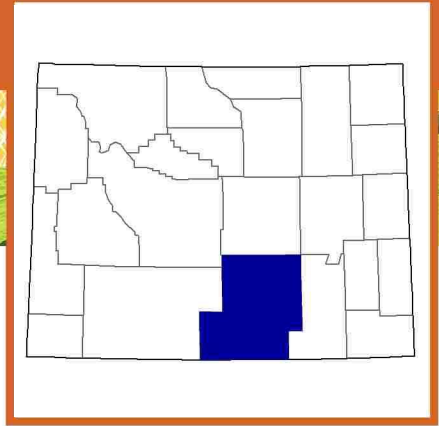
