

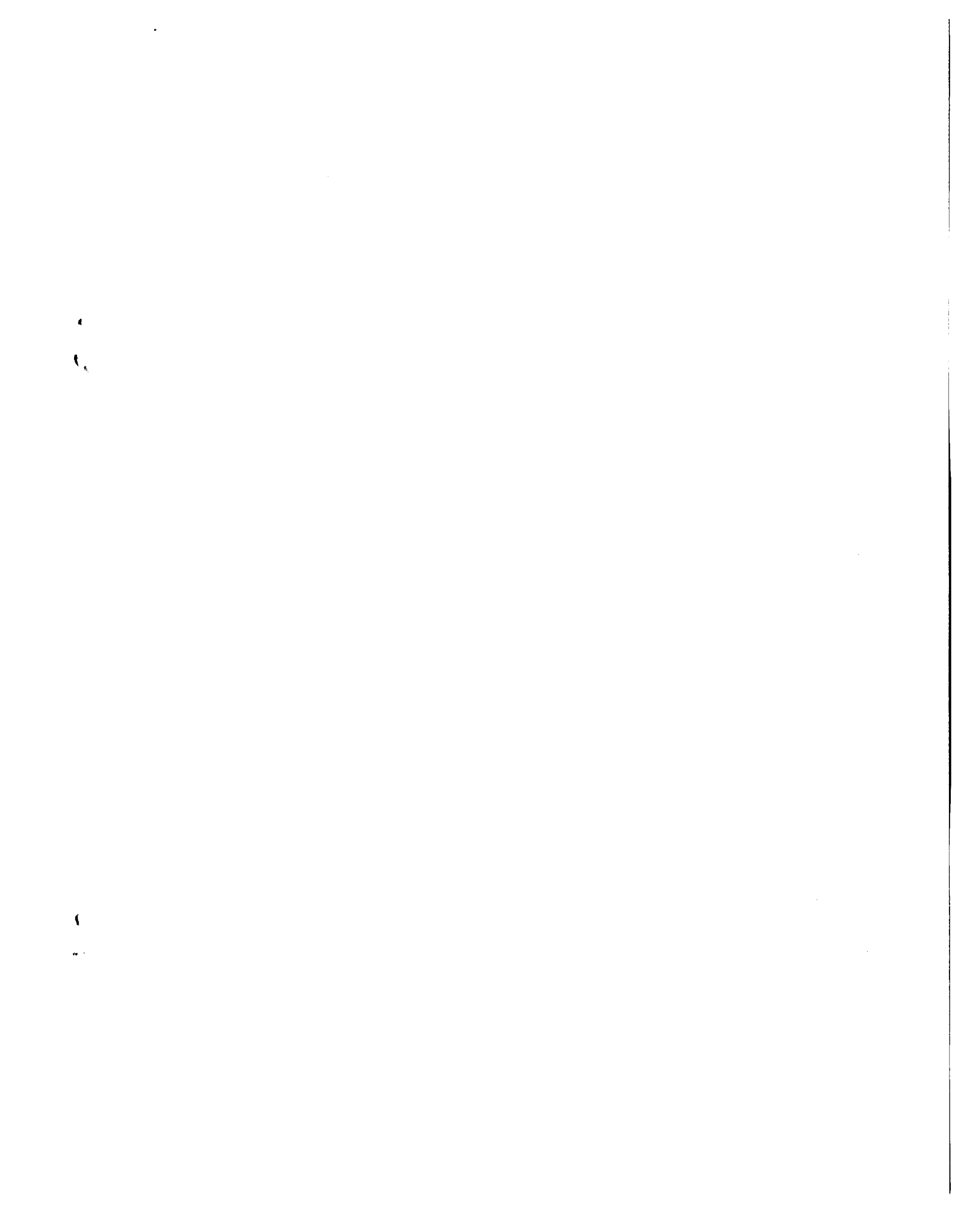

For all service and supplies as furnished, egg receipts are to be divided in the following manner:

1. PULLET SUPPLIER is to receive 29% of all proceeds after medications, sanitizers, and pullet insurance has been paid.
2. PRODUCER is to receive 17% of all proceeds after medications, sanitizers, and pullet insurance has been paid.
3. FEED SUPPLIER is to receive 54% of all proceeds after medications, sanitizers, and pullet insurance has been paid.

All egg receipts are to be sent to the Pullet Supplier who in turn agrees to furnish a complete audit every 28 days, along with distribution of the receipts as outlined above.

The Pullet Supplier also agrees to furnish a monthly progress report showing production, feed conversion, price received for eggs and other valuable statistics.

Example 3

PAYMENT TO THE PRODUCER FROM THE COMPANY

1. The Company and the Producer mutually agree that the Company will compensate the Producer for goods and services provided under this agreement.

Appendix H
