

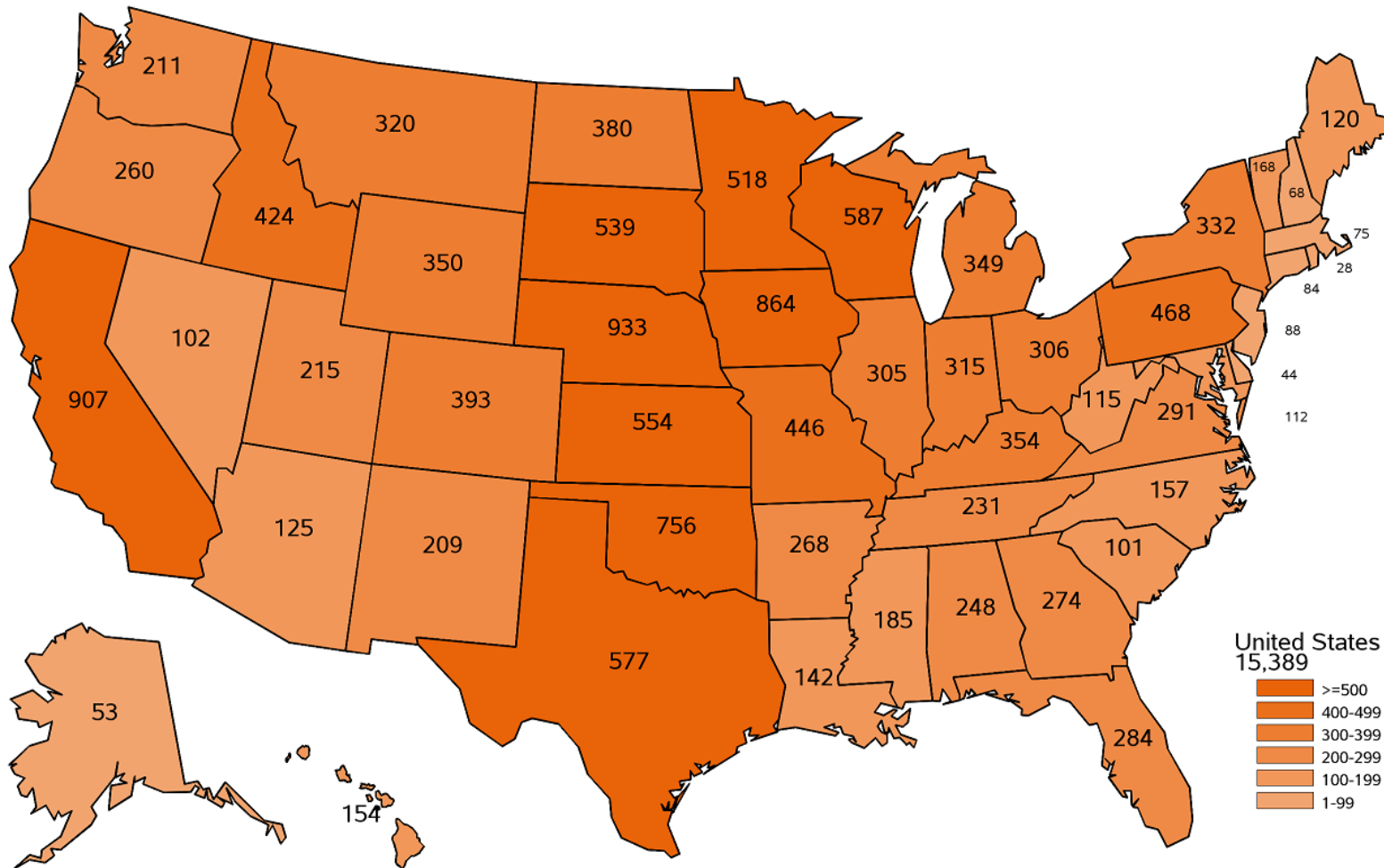

July 2022 Cattle Survey Number of Samples





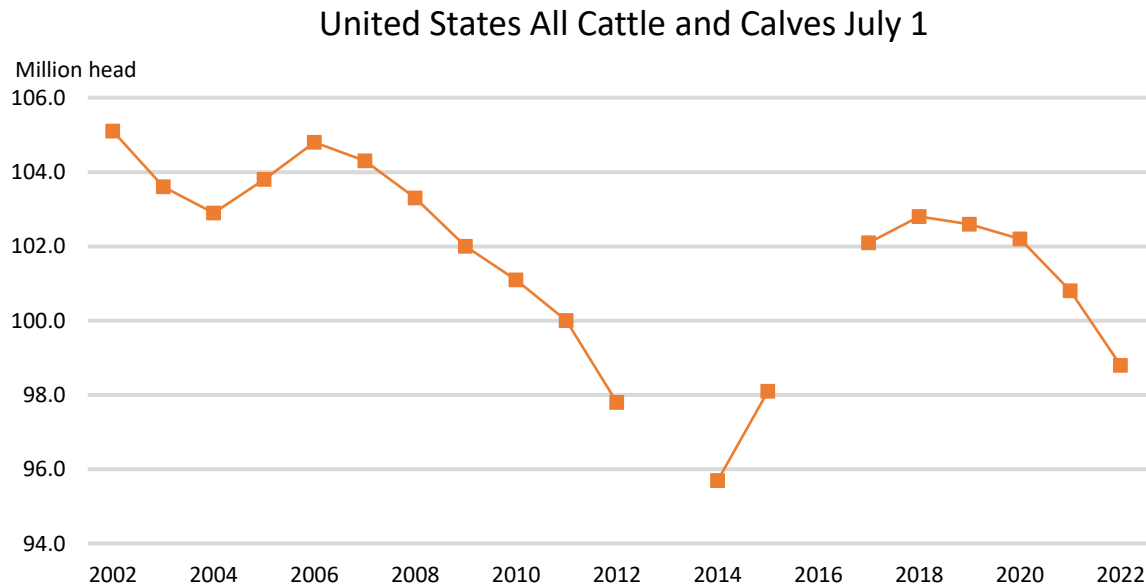

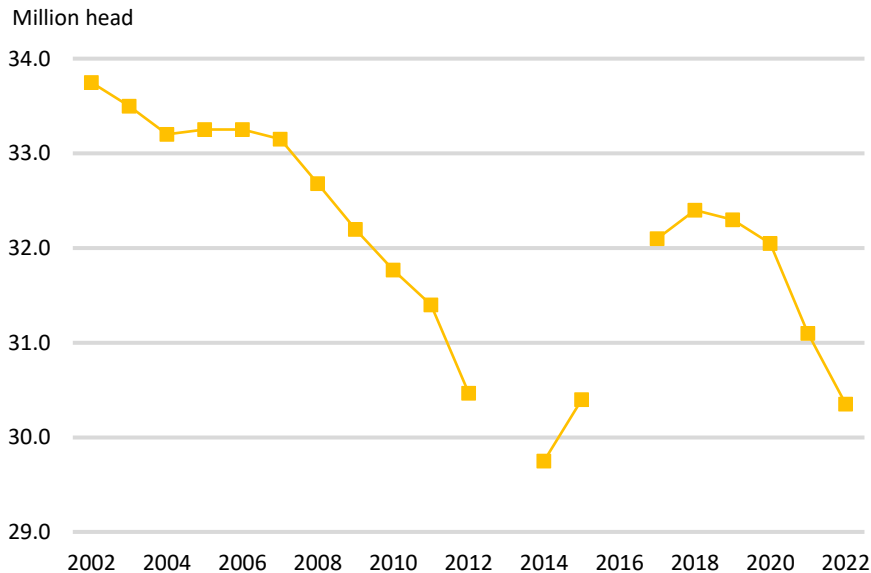

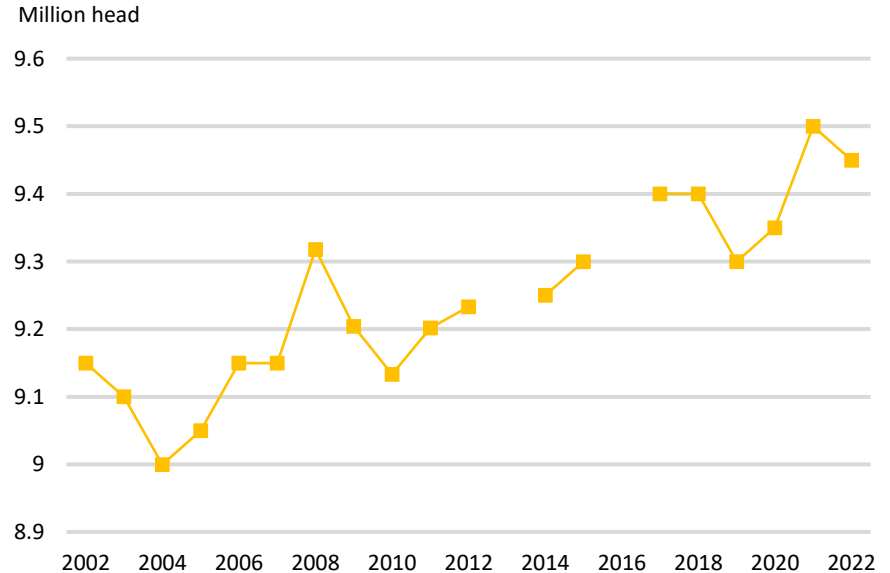

United States Milk Cows July 1

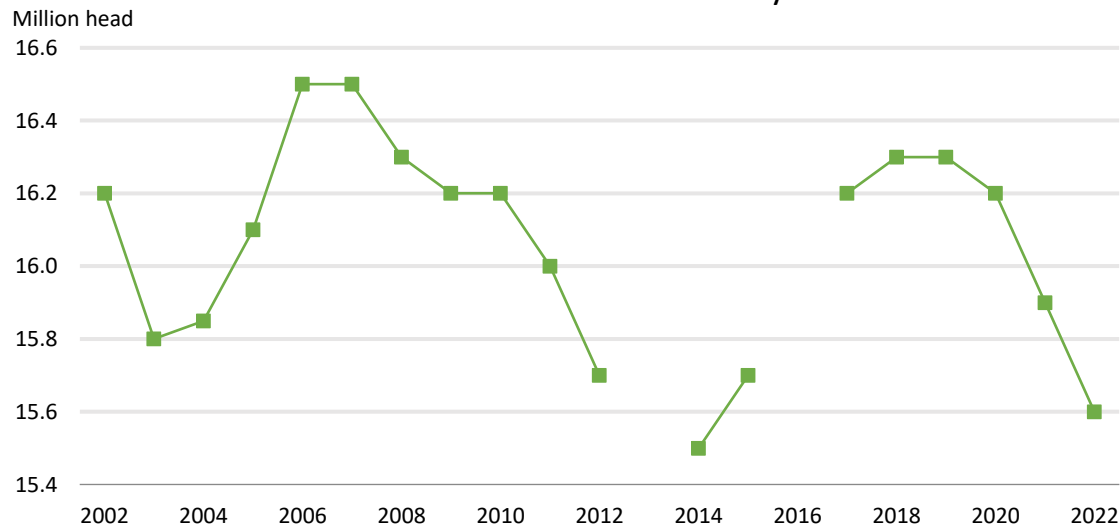

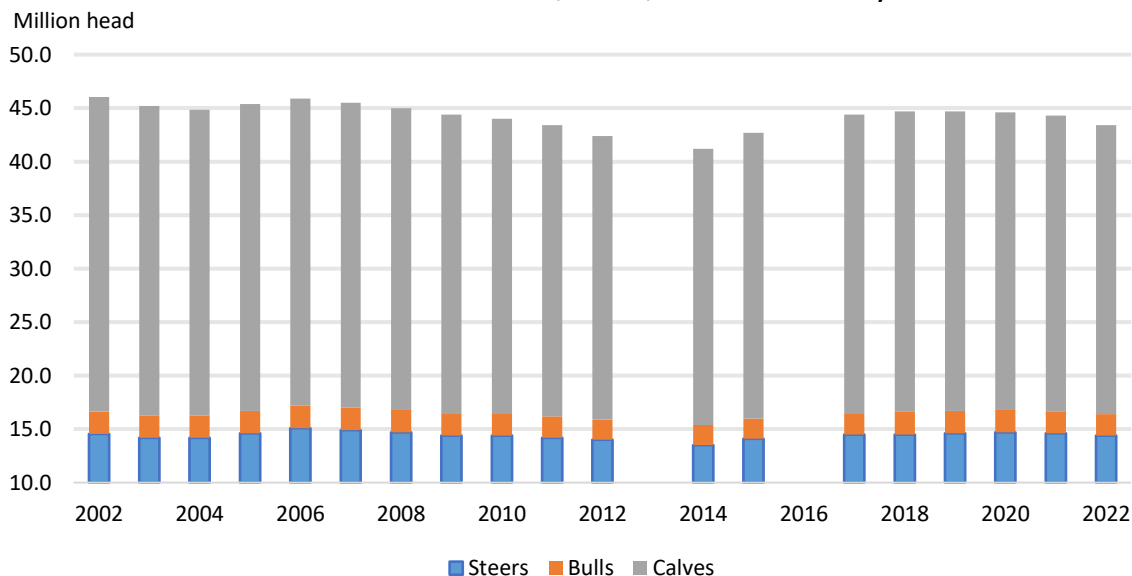

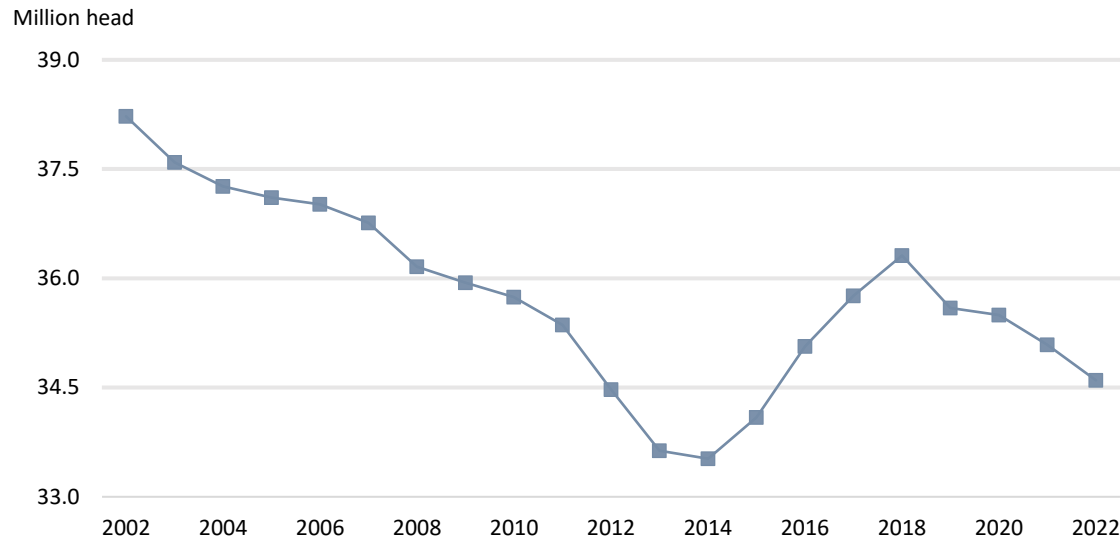

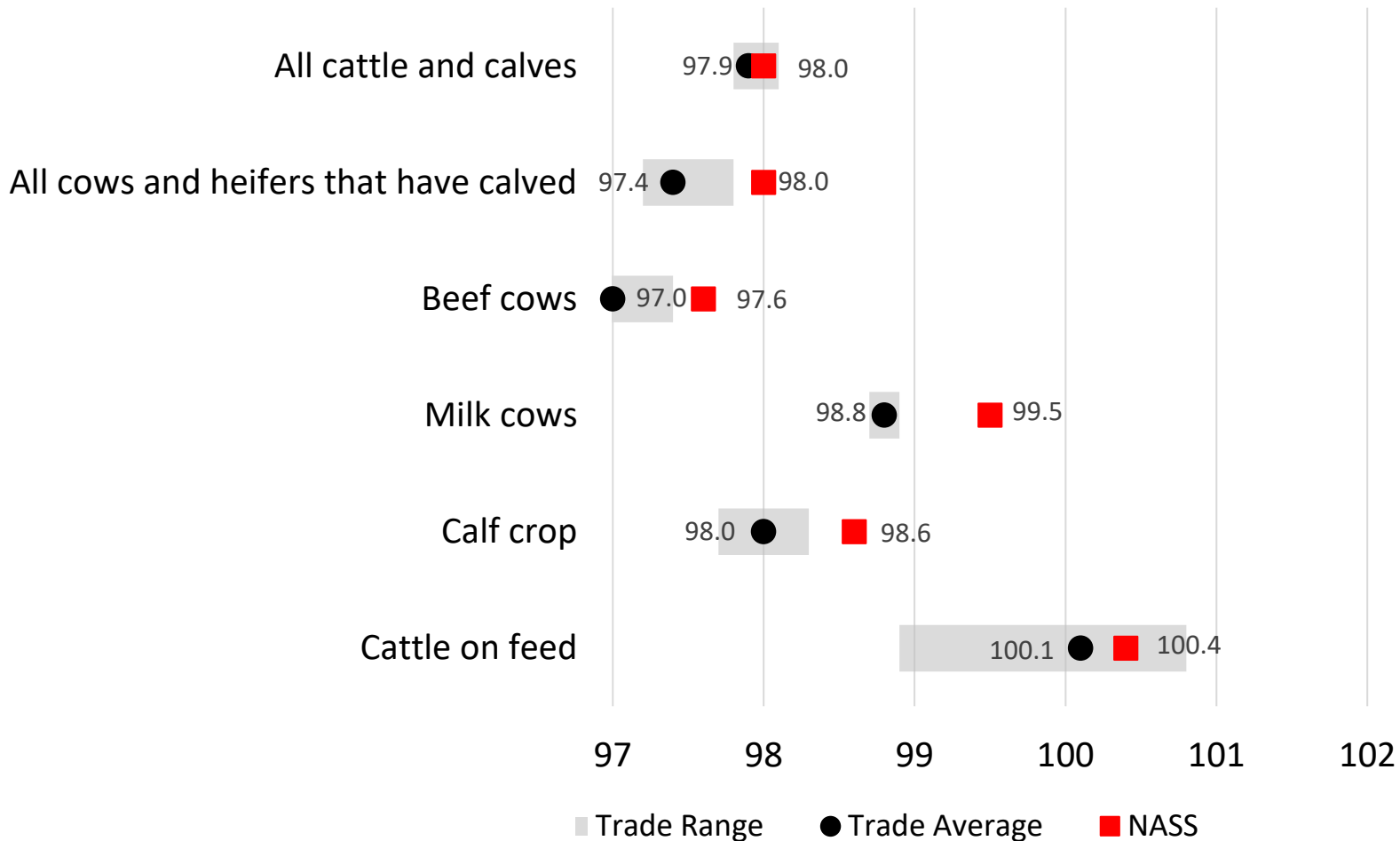

Trade Expectations Compared to NASS Estimates Percent of Previous Year

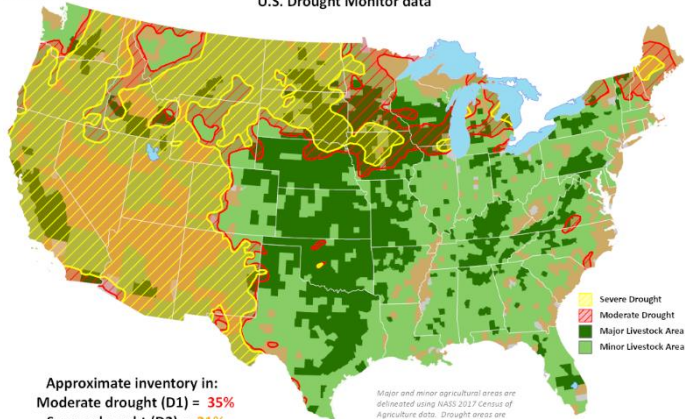

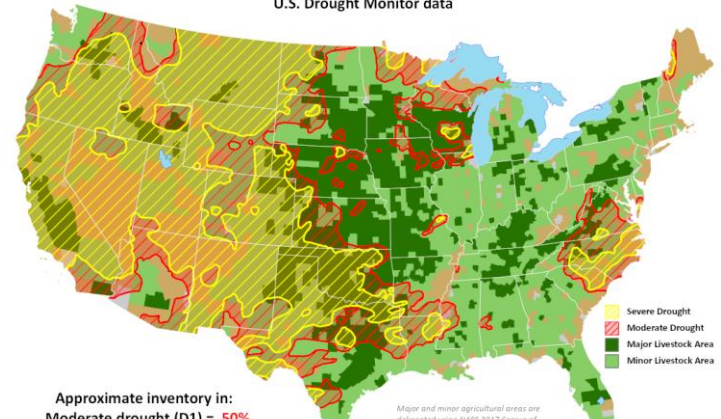

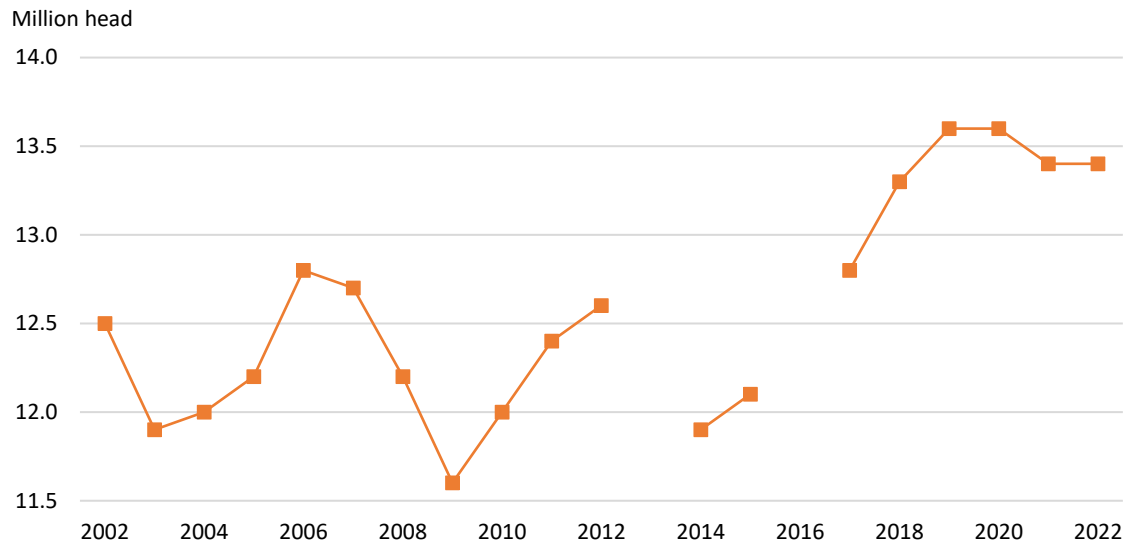

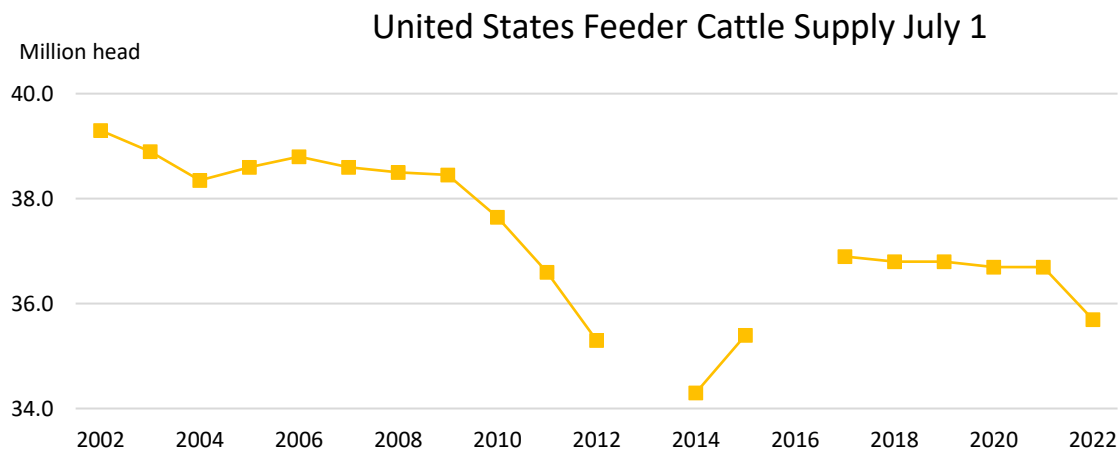
