AGRICULTURAL LEADERS ASK FARMERS TO SIGN UP AND BE COUNTED IN THE 2012 CENSUS OF AGRICULTURE

Washington, June 7, 2012 – The U.S. Department of Agriculture is preparing to mail the 2012 Census of Agriculture to millions of U.S. farmers and ranchers in late December. The Census of Agriculture is a complete count of U.S. farms and ranches and the people who operate them. Federal and state agricultural leaders are reminding producers, through a public service announcement campaign, not to miss their opportunity to be counted by signing up for the Census before July 1.

"Local and national leaders use the Census to make decisions that directly impact your business, your community and your industry," explain the leaders. "Whether you're farming four thousand acres or just four, it's important. Every voice counts."

These states are: Georgia, Indiana, Hawaii, Virginia, California and North Carolina.
