

### Baca County - Colorado Farms with American Indian or Alaska Native Operators Compared with All Farms





### Baca County - Colorado Farms with Asian Operators Compared with All Farms





### Baca County - Colorado Farms with Black or African American Operators Compared with All Farms





### Baca County - Colorado Farms with Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander Operators Compared with All Farms




