


## Salem County, New Jersey Farms with American Indian or Alaska Native Producers<sup>a</sup>




## Salem County, New Jersey Farms with Asian Producers<sup>a</sup>




## Salem County, New Jersey Farms with Black or African American Producers<sup>a</sup>






