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Arkansas Crop Progress and Condition

Delta Region - Arkansas Field Office

Week Ending: April 28, 2019

According to the National Agricultural Statistics Service in Arkansas, there were 4.0 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending Sunday, April 28, 2019. Topsoil moisture supplies were 0 percent very short, 2 percent short, 51 percent adequate, and 47 percent surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies were 1 percent very short, 3 percent short, 51 percent adequate, and 45 percent surplus. Low temperatures ranged from 46.6 degrees Fahrenheit at Gilbert to 59.0 degrees Fahrenheit at Pine Bluff. Highs ranged from 70.8 degrees Fahrenheit at Winslow to 80.5 degrees Fahrenheit at Prescott. Heavy precipitation was received throughout the State, with the highest concentration occurring in the north central part of the State with an average of 1.67 inches.

"Row crop farmers had a couple days early in the week to be in the field. Rain has many fields saturated and will be several days before fieldwork can start if no additional rain is received. Forages made moderate growth with moisture and warmer temperatures. Herbicide applications in both row crop and forages were made early in the week."

"Same story just different week. Just when producers could get in the field it rained again. A little more corn was planted. Hay fields that were sprayed for winter weeds a month ago are really looking good as the Bermuda grass is really moving in those fields. Hay fields need the first application of fertilizer now, but fields are too wet to apply."

"Fertilizer on pastures is about finished. Spraying pastures continue. Some producers in the county hay finished making haylage with their rye crops. Planting summer annuals will begin very soon."

"Wheat is not headed yet. Fescue is headed and with very little fodder."
