## USDA TO GATHER DATA ON SOYBEAN PRODUCTION

**Little Rock, AR** – In July, U.S. Department of Agriculture’s National Agricultural Statistics Service (NASS) will reach out to soybean producers across the country to begin collecting information for its’ monthly *Crop Production* report. Each year the Soybean Objective Yield Survey monitors selected sample soybean fields during the growing season. By gathering data on soybean plant maturity, pod counts and weight, NASS can better determine an official estimate of soybean yield and production.

“In July, NASS representatives, called a NASDA Enumerator, will contact selected producers in eleven major soybean producing states, I am proud Arkansas is one of those states,” said Becky Cross, Director, NASS Delta Regional Office. This initial visit with producers consists of a brief interview to determine field production and to gain permission to enter the selected fields. The survey continues with monthly measurements until after harvest, however these periodic visits do not require any additional time from the producer . Along with regular measurements, NASS includes some fields in a post-harvest gleaning sample.

In Arkansas, NASS surveys approximately 250 soybean producers. By participating, soybean producers ensure NASS provides timely, accurate and objective data that all sectors of the U.S. soybean industry can depend on to help make sound business decisions.

Information provided by respondents for all NASS surveys is confidential by law. NASS safeguards privacy of all responses and publishes only aggregate data, ensuring that no individual operation or producer can be identified.

NASS publishes the survey results in the monthly *Crop Production* Report, August through November 2016. NASS will, also, provide final soybean yield and production estimates in its’ *Annual Crop Production* report in January 2017.
