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U.S. JUNE EGG PRODUCTION


U.S. egg production totaled 7.45 billion during June 2010, up 1 percent from last year. Production included 6.38 billion table eggs, and 1.07 billion hatching eggs, of which 1.00 billion were broiler-type and 69 million were egg-type. The total number of layers during June 2010 averaged 338 million, up 1 percent from last year. June egg production per 100 layers was 2,203 eggs, unchanged from June 2009.

CALIFORNIA EGG PRODUCTION


California's egg production during June totaled 442 million, down seven million from May's production, but up eight million from June 2009. The average number of layers during the month totaled 19.5 million, up slightly from both last month and from June 2009. Eggs per 100 layers during the month were 2,268, compared to 2,313 a month earlier, and 2,234 in June 2009.

All layers in the U.S. on July 1, 2010 totaled 339 million, up 2 percent from last year. The 339 million layers consisted of 281 million layers producing table or market type eggs, 55.6 million layers producing broiler-type hatching eggs, and 2.91 million layers producing egg-type hatching eggs. Rate of lay per day on July 1, 2010, averaged 73.2 eggs per 100 layers, down 1 percent from July 1, 2009.

U.S. BROILER-TYPE CHICK HATCH

Broiler-type chicks hatched during June 2010 totaled 787 million, up 2 percent from June 2009. Eggs in incubators totaled 652 million on July 1, 2010, up 3 percent from a year earlier.

Leading breeders placed 7.59 million broiler-type pullet chicks for future domestic hatchery supply flocks during June 2010, up 6 percent from June 2009.




U.S. EGG-TYPE CHICK HATCHED

Egg-type chicks hatched during June 2010 totaled 42.6 million, up 2 percent from June 2009. Eggs in incubators totaled 37.5 million on July 1, 2010, up 13 percent from a year ago.

Domestic placements of egg-type pullet chicks for future hatchery supply flocks by leading breeders totaled 318 thousand during June 2010, down 1 percent from June 2009.



U.S. POULTRY AND EGG PRICES

Nationally, the June market egg price, at 42.2 cents per dozen, decreased 1.9 cents from May, but increased 3.3 cents from June 2009. The June broiler price, at 51.0 cents per pound, is unchanged both from May and from a year ago. The June turkey price, at 61.7 cents per pound, is up 5.6 cents from the previous month and up 9.2 cents from a year earlier.

U.S. TURKEY HATCHERY PRODUCTION


Turkey eggs in incubators on July 1, 2010, in the United States, totaled 29.7 million, down 1 percent from July 1, 2009. Eggs in incubators were up 4 percent from the June 1, 2010 total of 28.7 million eggs. Regional changes from the previous year were: East North Central up 7 percent, West North Central down slightly, North and South Atlantic up 3 percent, and South Central and West down 17 percent.

Turkey poults hatched during June 2010, in the United States, totaled 24.4 million, down 1 percent from June 2009. Poults hatched were up 1 percent from the May 2010 total of 24.2 million poults. Regional changes from the previous year were: East North Central up 11 percent, West North Central up 2 percent, North and South Atlantic down 1 percent, and South Central and West down 25 percent.

The 24.1 million net poults placed during June 2010 in the United States were down slightly from the number placed during the same month a year earlier. Net placements were up slightly from the May 2010 total of 24.0 million.
