Agricultural Summary: Above normal temperatures in January improved the outlook for livestock producers. However, as snow cover protection was limited by warm temperatures, a decline in winter wheat conditions was realized. Mountain snowpack statewide was 81 percent of average at the end of the month. The Southwest and San Luis Valley were 66 percent and 65 percent of average, respectively.
