Rain is Needed Soon

For the week ending, June 20, 2010, the days suitable for fieldwork were **6.7** days in Maryland and **7** days in Delaware. Soil moisture ratings are now rating primarily short to adequate for both Maryland and Delaware. Most crop reporters are observing hot and dry weather and a need for rain. One Maryland crop reporter reported a, *“hot dry week drastically lowered the soil moisture. . . corn is showing moisture stress”* while another reported *“both corn and beans are stressed. Corn beginning to tassel so rains are needed soon or yields will be hurt.”*

Hay supplies remained adequate throughout Maryland and Delaware. **Pasture** is rated fair to good for Maryland and Delaware. **Small grains and corn for grain** are in good condition in Maryland and fair to good for Delaware. Maryland is reporting 54 percent completed for the second cutting of **alfalfa hay**, while Delaware reached 45 percent completion and both states are reporting 42 percent completion for the second cutting of **other hay**. Maryland is reporting 85 percent planted and 76 percent emerged for **soybeans** and Delaware is reporting 90 percent planted and 80 percent emerged. **Barley** is 63 percent harvested for Maryland and 74 percent harvested for Delaware. Maryland is reporting 22 percent completed for **winter wheat** harvest and Delaware is reporting 30 percent completed. **Strawberries** are 99 percent harvested in both Maryland and Delaware.
