Delaware Crop Production Summary Report

DOVER, DE – The USDA-NASS, Northeastern Region has released the crop production forecast for November, according to Shareefah Williams, state statistician of the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service (NASS), Delaware Field Office. The latest survey, which was conducted during the last week of October and first week of November, included the following commodities:

Corn production is forecast at 30.8 million bushels, up 6% from 2019. Based on conditions as of November 1, yields are expected to average 181.0 bushels per acre, up 20 bushels from the 2019 average. Area harvested for grain is forecast at 170 thousand acres, down 10 thousand acres from 2019.

Soybean production is forecast at 6.96 million bushels, down 3% from last year. Based on November 1 conditions, yields are expected to average 47.0 bushels per acre, unchanged from last year. Area for harvest is forecast at 148 thousand acres, down 5 thousand acres from 2019.

Production forecasts are released on a monthly basis and do not reflect final production estimates. The next production forecast will be issued December 10, 2020.
