Farm Cash Receipts and Expenditures




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Florida Cash Receipts

The Economic Research Service reports that cash receipts from Florida agricultural products in 2010 totaled to \$7.81 billion. This is an increase of 8.9 percent from 2009. Cash receipts by category compared to the previous year were: Citrus: \$1.53 billion, up 5.9 percent; Other Fruit and Nuts: \$456 million, up 11.4 percent; Vegetables and Melons: \$1.94 billion, up 9.2 percent; Field Crops: \$783.9 million, up 22.8 percent; Greenhouse and Nursery: \$1.75 billion, down 2.5 percent; and Livestock and Products: \$1.35 billion, up 22.1 percent.

Fruits and Nuts: The 2010 cash receipts for Fruits and Nuts totaled \$1.98 billion, up 7.1 percent from the previous year. Citrus cash receipts from grapefruit, oranges, tangelos and tangerines totaled \$1.53 billion, compared to \$1.44 billion a year earlier. Cash receipts for grapefruit at \$204.8 million were up 41.2 percent, oranges at \$1.25 billion were up 1.1 percent, tangelos at \$8.3 million were up 19.7 percent, and tangerines at \$65.3 million were up 17.6 percent. Strawberries cash receipts at \$362.0 million were up 15.4 percent.

Vegetables and Melons: The 2010 cash receipts for Vegetables and Melons totaled \$1.94 billion, were up 9.2 percent from the previous year. Fresh tomatoes at \$630.8 million increased 21.3 percent from the previous year. Fresh green peppers at \$295.6 million were up 48.9 percent.

Field Crops: The 2010 Cash receipts for Field Crops at \$783.9 million were up 22.9 percent. Peanuts at \$89.6 million were up 34.6 percent. Cotton cash receipts, including lint and cotton seed, at \$49.5 million, were up 48.7 percent.

Greenhouse and Nursery: Cash receipts for greenhouse and nursery products totaled \$1.75 billion, down 2.5 percent.

Livestock: The 2010 Cash receipts for Livestock and Livestock Products at \$1.35 billion were up 22.1 percent. Meat Animals receipts at \$505.2 million were up 33.4 percent, dairy products at \$439.0 million were up 25.4 percent. Poultry and Eggs totaled \$305.7 million, up 12.8 percent.

Net value-added is the sector's contribution to the National economy and is the sum of the income from production earned by all factors-of-production, regardless of ownership. Net farm income is the farm operators' share of income from the sector's production activities. The concept presented is consistent with that employed by the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development]
