General

According to the National Agricultural Statistics Service in Georgia, there were 5.5 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending Sunday, November 27, 2022. Precipitation ranged from 0.1 inches to 3.3 inches of rain. Average high temperatures ranged from the low 60s to the low 70s. Average low temperatures ranged from the low 30s to the mid 50s.

Crops

Temperatures were mild to warm across the state for this time of the year. Cotton fields continued to be harvested. Rains in southeastern Georgia reportedly slowed down cotton harvest. In many areas cotton harvest was winding down and fields were mown or had stalks pulled or disked up. Several of these fields were already planted in either small grains or cover crops the winter season. Peanut and soybean harvest continued to progress as they neared completion. Small grains were continuing to be planted by the day and between either truck broadcasting the seeds, or grain drills sowing grain. Pecan harvest neared completion and onions continued to be transplanted.

Livestock and Pastures

Cattle remained in good condition while pastures were in fair condition throughout the state. Cattlemen reported that they were feeding hay and planting winter grazing. Winter forages in northeast Georgia were noted to have successfully established, having benefited greatly from recent rains.

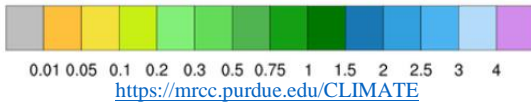
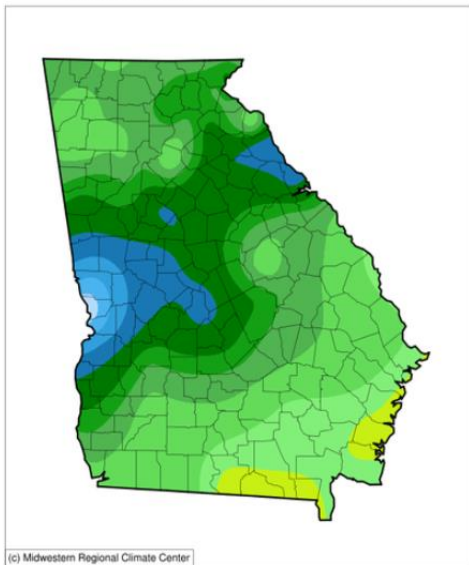

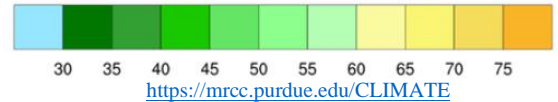
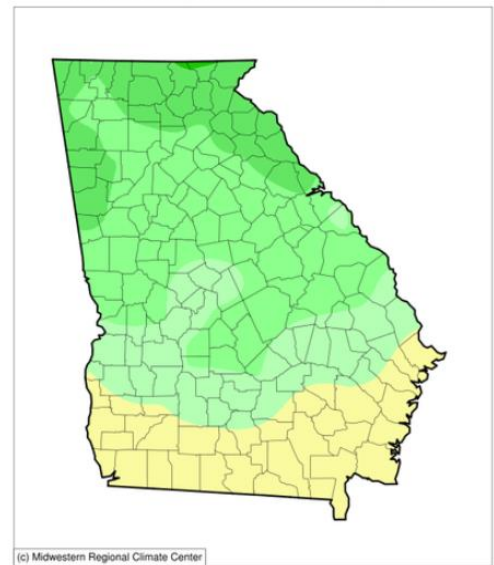

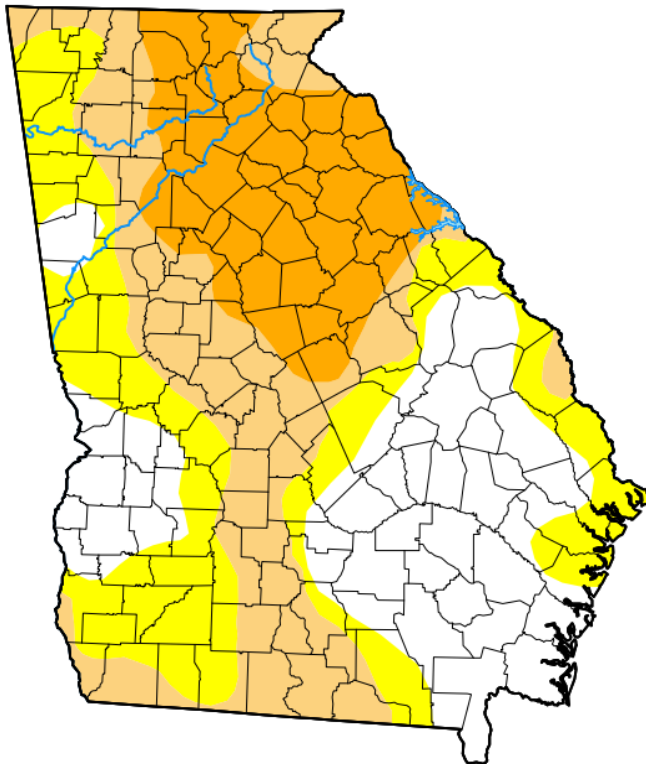
Accumulated Precipitation (in)
