General

According to the National Agricultural Statistics Service in Georgia, there were 6.4 days suitable for fieldwork for the week ending Sunday, April 23, 2023. Precipitation ranged from no rain to 1.0 inch of rain. Average high temperatures ranged from the low 70s to the low 80s. Average low temperatures ranged from the low 40s to the mid 50s.

Crops

Ideal weather conditions allowed farmers ample time for fieldwork during the week. Corn continued to be planted across the state and emerging in many areas. Some corn fields were sprayed with herbicides and side-dressed with nitrogen. Cotton, peanut, and soybean planting began in some areas during the week. Cotton and peanut planting are anticipated to ramp up over the next few weeks once temperatures warm up. Harvest of Vidalia onions continued to be wide open and will continue for the next few weeks. Winter wheat headed out and was starting to dry down in some areas. Dry conditions in southern Georgia wheat fields caused farmers to irrigate their crop last week.

Livestock and Pastures

Cattle and pasture and ranges were in good to fair condition throughout the state. Warmer weather and little rain in some areas helped dry up muddy conditions which were troubling livestock producers. Pastures continued to green up and grow with the warmer temperatures.





Accumulated Precipitation (in)




Average Temperature (°F) April 17, 2023 to April 23, 2023
