Snow Melted and Crops Were Being Planted in Idaho

3.7 days last week were suitable for fieldwork. Pasture and range conditions were 11% very poor, 12% poor, 23% fair, 26% good, and 28% excellent. The low temperature was 11 degrees Fahrenheit in the eastern region, while the high temperature was 72 degrees Fahrenheit in the southwest region. There was a statewide temperature differential of 5 degrees Fahrenheit below to 6 degrees Fahrenheit above normal. Spring plantings of barley, oats, sugar beets, onions, and spring wheat began. The northern region reported field conditions were too wet, even though snow cover was rapidly melting. Elmore County reported potato planting with warming soil temperatures. Heavy vole damage was observed throughout the Magic Valley in not only alfalfa fields, but also winter wheat fields. In the far-eastern region, another storm swept the valley, supplying more snow than what melted previously in the week. Spring calving and greenhouse prepping was underway.

Cooler and Drier Weather Made for Good Planting Conditions in Oregon

There were 4.9 days suitable for fieldwork in Oregon last week. Pasture and range conditions were reported to be 15% very poor, 25% poor, 20% fair, 38% good, and 2% excellent. A low temperature was reported at 16 degrees Fahrenheit in the south central region. A high temperature was reported at 73 degrees Fahrenheit in the southwest region. The statewide temperature differential ranged from 4 degrees below to 6 degrees above average. Overall, producers across the state took advantage of cooler and drier weather to get crops planted. Noticeable progress was reported in both the grain and vegetable crops. Seed crop planting progressed as well. Nursery shipping also moved forward. The early spring weather allowed fertilizing and spraying of grass seed crops. Orchards continued to bud out throughout the state. The cooler weather held back pasture growth in some regions. The grass was growing, but feeding was still necessary and many livestock producers could not get cattle completely turned out on pasture. Ewe and lamb pairs coming off ryegrass looked excellent. Feeder lambs looked good as well. Winter wheat continued to look good and spring wheat planting progress ran ahead of normal. General consensus statewide was that additional moisture was needed. Oregon had below normal snowpack this year. However, water reservoirs were in good shape, as various irrigation districts started to turn on water.

Washington Remained Cool, While Planting Progressed

There were 5.5 days suitable for field work last week. Pasture and range conditions were reported at 4% very poor, 15% poor, 50% fair, 29% good, and 2% excellent. A low temperature of 22 degrees Fahrenheit was reported in the northeast region, while a high temperature of 69 was reported in the southeast region. Statewide temperature differentials ranged from 4 degrees below normal to 4 degrees above normal. In the west, reports revealed wet and cold conditions with decent amounts of rain throughout the region. Many fields remained wet, which slowed or prevented field work. Some pastures remained flooded with some farmers keeping their livestock on supplemental feed. In the central region, weather conditions were also relatively cold. Unlike the west though, conditions were dry, which allowed for plenty of field work. Some producers managed to start spring planting, while others prepared their fields for planting. Temperatures at night dropped below freezing. Livestock operations were doing well, with the spring calving season reporting average to high levels of survival among new calves. Peach and cherry orchards began to bloom, while apricots finished blooming. Vegetable growers tilled or planted their fields this week. In the eastern region, temperatures remained chilly as well. Much of the snow cover melted, revealing the winter wheat. Some producers reported a bit of flooding, while others reported muddy fields. Winter wheat appeared alright overall with only a few parts reporting damage or shorter crops. Most of the week allowed field work. Orchard and vineyards were pruned. Spring planting was underway, while some areas reported plantings had finished. Others began to spray their fields. Wind speeds were higher than normal, which led to some challenges for field workers. Overall, the state was relatively cold with most operations looking forward to warmer weather.
