Idaho Row Crops Harvest Continued in Seasonable Weather

There were 6.9 days suitable last week for fieldwork. Pasture and range conditions were 8% very poor, 32% poor, 36% fair, and 24% good. A low temperature of 18 degrees Fahrenheit was reported in the eastern region. A high temperature of 87 degrees Fahrenheit was reported in the south central region. The statewide temperature differential ranged from 4 degrees below to 3 degrees above normal. It was another good week to accomplish planting and harvest fieldwork in Idaho. Winter wheat planted advanced to levels slightly above the 5-year average. The potato and dry onion harvest were also ahead of the 5-year average. In the northern region, the weather shifted to cool fall temperatures. Areas of frost were reported throughout Boundary County. Fall field work was nearly complete. In southwest Idaho, it remained dry and some killing frosts were reported in Teton and Madison Counties.

The First Full Week of Autumn Remained Dry and Crisp in Oregon

There were 6.9 days suitable for fieldwork. Pasture and range conditions were 54% very poor, 24% poor, 18% fair, and 4% good. A low temperature was reported at 17 degrees Fahrenheit in the south central region of Oregon, and a high temperature was reported at 94 degrees Fahrenheit in the southwest region. The statewide temperature differential ranged from 6 degrees below average to 4 degrees above average. Some regions in Oregon received minor precipitation. However, most of the state remained quite dry. The cooler autumn-like temperatures continued to take some pressure off range conditions and moisture indications. However these indications continued to hover near crop-year 2018 lows. Statewide, pasture conditions remained fair to poor, depending on grazing demands. In northern Oregon, grass seed crops were mostly planted and started to emerge. The mild and warmer autumn weather helped late maturing crops like grapes and late season vegetables. Non-irrigated hay fields saw very little growth since harvest in late June. In north central Oregon, producers prepared to start seeding wheat. Many still hoped for more moisture before planting started. Pastures were dry and rangeland was poor for grazing livestock. In northeastern Oregon, early sown wheat emerged and most stands looked good. Later planted wheat was dusted in and was not anticipated to germinate and emerge until autumn rain wets the seedbed. In southwestern Oregon, some frost was reported in Jackson County. In Douglas County, hot weather returned and stressed early planted wheat, cover crops, and turf grass. A few early showers started the germination process, but no rain since had farmers concerned. The only crop group that thrived in the warm and dry fall was wine grapes. Wine grapes ripened under near perfect conditions with warm sunny days. Harvest was underway. In south central and southeastern Oregon, some beet dumps were opened and a very limited harvest started. Potato and carrot seed harvests were underway. There was still some hay to cut and some waiting to be baled. In general though, this region did not receive any significant rainfall to improve drought conditions.

Apple Harvest and Wheat Planting Progressed in Washington

There were 6.8 days suitable for field work last week. Pasture and range conditions were reported at 31% very poor, 26% poor, 28% fair, 14% good, and 1% excellent. A low temperature of 29 degrees Fahrenheit was reported in the northeast region, while a high temperature of 86 degrees Fahrenheit was reported in the western region. Statewide temperature differentials ranged from 3 degrees below to 5 degrees above normal. Western Washington was sunny and dry with a few showers last week. Corn was harvested, late grain combined, and cover crops planted in Snohomish County. Some pastures and grass silage fields were rebounding after the rain, but were slow to recover. Tomatoes, peppers, and fall brassicas were harvested. Some potato blight was reported due to moisture, but no damage was recorded since the crop was mostly sized up. Dairy producers were finishing their final cutting of grass for silage in Whatcom County and corn harvest was ongoing. Some cranberry growers in Pacific County were having issues harvesting with the current water shortage. San Juan County had fruit crops in prime harvest. CSA farms continued to harvest and market late season vegetables and winter squash. The 2019 winter wheat crop in Chelan and Douglas Counties was in good condition. Adequate moisture allowed a stand to be established. A fire in northern Douglas County burned over 50,000 acres of pasture. Some livestock producers were feeding their cattle since no alternative grazing land was available. Apple harvest continued. Livestock producers in Klickitat County were looked for hay to purchase since winter pastures did not have enough regrowth. Fall wheat planting started. Kittitas County had light frost two nights last week. A few small blocks of wine grapes were harvested in Franklin County. Carrots, apples, and some pears were in full harvest. Fall work slowly continued in Asotin County, but many producers were waiting for rain.
