MINK AND HONEY

MINK: Illinois ranks tenth nationally in mink pelt production. Production of mink pelts in Illinois increased 14 percent in 2004 to 59,700 pelts. Females bred to produce kits in 2005 totaled 16,000, up eight percent from the number of females bred to produce kits in 2004.

HONEY: Illinois honey production in 2004 from producers with five or more colonies totaled 385,000 pounds, down eight percent from 2003. Prices for 2004 Illinois honey averaged \$1.93 per pound, up 20 cents from the 2003 price. The total value of honey production was \$743,000, up two percent from 2003. Prices are based on retail sales by producers and sales to private processors and cooperatives.
