

# MINK AND HONEY

MINK: Illinois ranks eleventh nationally in mink pelt production. Production of mink pelts in Illinois decreased 22 percent in 2010 to 55,260 pelts. Females bred to produce kits in 2011 totaled 20,530, up 12 percent from the previous year.

HONEY: Illinois honey production in 2010, from producers with 5 or more colonies, totaled 369,000 pounds, up 36 percent from the previous year. Prices for Illinois honey averaged \$3.05 per pound, up 50 cents from the previous year. The total value of honey production was 1.1 million dollars, up 62 percent from 2009. Prices are based on retail sales by producers and sales to private processors and cooperatives.
