



Illinois June Acreage

Released June 30, 2016

Corn: Planted area, at 11.7 million acres, is unchanged from 2015. Harvested area for grain, at 11.5 million acres, is also unchanged from last year.

Soybeans: Planted area, at 9.90 million acres, is up 1 percent from 2015. This represents the highest planted acreage since 2006. Harvested area, forecast at 9.84 million acres, is up 1 percent from the previous year.

Winter wheat: Planted area for 2016, estimated at 560,000 acres, is up 4 percent from 2015. Area harvested for grain is forecast at 520,000 acres, unchanged from the previous year.

Hay: Harvested area of all hay is expected to total 480,000 acres, down 2 percent from 2015. This consists of 240,000 acres of alfalfa and 240,000 acres of all other hay.
