



Illinois Hogs and Pigs

Released June 25, 2020

Illinois inventory of all hogs and pigs on June 1, 2020 was 5.50 million head, up 2 percent from March 1, 2020 and up 3 percent from last year. **Breeding inventory**, at 570,000 head, was down 10,000 from the previous quarter and down 20,000 from last year. **Market hog inventory**, at 4.93 million head, was up 2 percent from last quarter and up 4 percent from last year.

The March-May 2020 pig crop, at 2.97 million head, was up slightly from 2019. Sows farrowing during this period totaled 275,000 head, unchanged from a year ago. The average pigs saved per litter was 10.80 for the March-May period, compared with 10.75 last year.


