

Illinois Hogs and Pigs

Illinois inventory of all hogs and pigs on March 1, 2024 was 5.60 million head, up 2 percent from December 1, 2023 and up 3 percent from last year. **Breeding inventory**, at 670,000 head, was up 40,000 from the previous quarter and up 20,000 from last year. **Market hog inventory**, at 4.93 million head, was up 1 percent from last quarter and up 3 percent from last year.

The December-February 2024 pig crop, at 3.30 million head, was up 11 percent from 2023. Sows farrowing during this period totaled 300,000 head, up 20,000 from a year ago. The average pigs saved per litter was 11.00 for the December-February period, compared with 10.60 last year.
