
FARM INCOME

CASH RECEIPTS

Indiana farmers received \$5.58 billion in cash receipts from farm marketings in 2005, 8 percent below 2004. Cash receipts from crops were down 12 percent, and receipts for livestock were down 1 percent from the previous year. Marketings of crops at \$3.54 billion, accounted for 63.4 percent of the total cash receipts in 2005 while livestock receipts, at \$2.04 billion, accounted for the remaining 36.6 percent. In the previous year crop receipts accounted for 66.1 percent and livestock 33.9 percent of total cash receipts.

Corn was the leading source of income for Indiana farmers in 2005 and amounted to \$1.51 billion. Soybeans were second at \$1.50 billion and meat animals were third with \$1.01 billion. Dairy became the fourth leading contributor with \$503 million and Poultry and eggs follows with \$494 million. These five commodity groups accounted for almost 90 percent of the 2005 cash receipts.
