


FARM INCOME

CASH RECEIPTS

Indiana farmers received \$9.96 billion in cash receipts from farm marketings in 2008, 24 percent above 2007. Cash receipts from crops were up 30 percent, and receipts for livestock were 10 percent above the previous year. Marketings of crops at \$7.11 billion, accounted for 71.4 percent of the total cash receipts in 2008 while livestock receipts, at \$2.86 billion, accounted for the remaining 28.7 percent. In the previous year crop receipts accounted for 67.8 percent and livestock 32.2 percent of total cash receipts.

Corn was the leading source of income for Indiana farmers in 2008 and amounted to \$3.95 billion. Soybeans were second at \$2.43 billion and meat animals were third with \$1.18 billion. Poultry and Eggs remained as the fourth leading contributor with \$1.01 billion and Dairy follows with \$640 million. These five commodity groups accounted for almost 93 percent of the 2008 cash receipts.
