
FARM INCOME

CASH RECEIPTS

Indiana farmers received \$8.76 billion in cash receipts from farm marketings in 2009, 8 percent below 2008. Cash receipts from crops were down 4 percent, and receipts for livestock were 17 percent below the previous year. Marketings of crops at \$6.39 billion, accounted for 73.0 percent of the total cash receipts in 2009 while livestock receipts, at \$2.37 billion, accounted for the remaining 27.0 percent. In the previous year crop receipts accounted for 70.0 percent and livestock 30.0 percent of total cash receipts.

Corn was the leading source of income for Indiana farmers in 2009 and amounted to \$3.29 billion. Soybeans were second at \$2.52 billion and meat animals were third with \$1.06 billion. Poultry and Eggs remained as the fourth leading contributor with \$829 million and Dairy follows with \$450 million. These five commodity groups accounted for 93 percent of the 2009 cash receipts.
