

## LIVESTOCK HIGHLIGHTS

The total value of the four major species of livestock and poultry on Indiana farms January 1, 2011 (December 1, 2010 for swine and chickens) amounted to \$1,247.9 million, up 11 percent from a year earlier.

**HOG AND PIG** numbers (December 1, 2010), at 3.65 million, were up 1 percent from a year earlier. The average value per head increased from \$84.00 in 2009 to \$110.00 in 2010. This raised the total inventory value to \$401.5 million, 33 percent above a year ago. Indiana remained in fifth place in the nation for the number of hogs on hand December 1, 2010.

**CATTLE** inventory numbers, at 850,000, were down 2 percent from January 1, 2010 but value per head, at \$920 was \$50 above the previous year. Total cattle inventory value, at \$782.0 million, increased 3 percent from the \$756.9 million last year. Cows and heifers that have calved totaled 385,000 head, down 1 percent

from a year earlier. Of this total, 213,000 were beef cows, down 4 percent; and 172,000 were milk cows, up 2 percent from the previous year.

Total **SHEEP** inventory, at 50,000 head for January 1, 2011, was down 4 percent, from a year earlier. Breeding sheep totaled 44,000 head. Average value per head at \$227.00, was up \$40.00 from 2010. Total inventory value at \$11.4 million was 17 percent above the previous year.

Total **CHICKEN** inventory, excluding broilers, on December 1, 2010, at 30.6 million birds, was down 3 percent from last year. With this inventory, Indiana held on to third place in the nation for total chickens, excluding broilers, and remained in third position for hens and pullets of laying age (23.4 million). The total value of the chicken inventory was \$52.1 million, down 8 percent from 2009. The value per bird decreased \$0.10 from the previous year to \$1.70.

## HOGS AND PIGS

The total pig crop in 2010 was up 6 percent from the pig crop in 2009. Sows farrowed during the year was up 6 percent from the previous year, while litter rates increased 1 percent to 9.50. A \$9.80 increase in average price per hundredweight resulted in a 22 percent increase in cash receipts for 2010. Gross income of \$1.02 billion (cash receipts plus value of home consumption) increased 22 percent from a year earlier.





## CATTLE AND DAIRY PRODUCTS

The total live weight of cattle and calves marketed during 2010 increased 11 percent from a year earlier. The average price for cattle increased \$9.90 per cwt. to \$83.70. Calf prices for 2010 averaged \$107.00 per cwt. compared with \$96.40 during 2009. Cash receipts totaled \$273 million, up 25 percent from the \$217 million a year earlier. Gross income (cash receipts plus value of home consumption) increased 26 percent from a year earlier.



## COMMERCIAL CATTLE SLAUGHTER NUMBER OF HEAD, INDIANA, 2005-2010





## SHEEP AND GOATS

The number of sheep and lambs marketed during 2010 increased 4 percent to 36,000 head. The total pounds of sheep and lambs marketed was up 13 percent from the 2009 level. Cash receipts totaled \$3.28 million, up 27 percent from \$2.58 million in 2009. Gross income (cash receipts plus value of home consumption) totaled \$4.07 million in 2010 compared with \$3.24 million a year earlier. Sheep averaged \$52.40 per cwt. and lambs averaged \$124.00 per cwt. during 2010.

Lambs saved in 2010, at 44,000 head, was unchanged from the previous year. The number of ewes one year old and older on hand January 1, 2011 was down 6 percent from 2010. Lamb Crop per 100 ewes one year old and older was 122 during 2010, down 5 percent from a year earlier.

Wool production was down 4 percent from the previous year, at 230,000 pounds. Sheep and lambs shorn totaled 37,000 head with an average fleece weight of 6.2 pounds. Total value of shorn wool was \$87,000, up 58 percent from a year earlier and averaged 38 cents per pound.



## COMMERCIAL SHEEP SLAUGHTER NUMBER OF HEAD, INDIANA, 2005-2010






