

## LIVESTOCK HIGHLIGHTS

**HOG AND PIG** numbers (December 1, 2012), at 3.8 million, were unchanged from a year earlier. The average value per head decreased from \$120.00 in 2011 to \$115.00 in 2012. This dropped the total inventory value to \$437.0 million, 4 percent below a year ago. Indiana remained in fifth place in the nation for the number of hogs on hand December 1, 2012.

**CATTLE** inventory numbers, at 810,000, were down 6 percent from January 1, 2012 while value per head, at \$1,030 was \$30 above the previous year. Total cattle inventory value, at \$834.3 million, decreased 3 percent from the \$860.0 million last year. Cows and heifers that have calved totaled 365,000 head, down 1 percent from a year earlier. Of this total, 191,000 were beef cows, down 2 percent; and 174,000 were milk cows, down 1 percent from the previous year.

Total **SHEEP** inventory, at 55,000 head for January 1, 2013, was unchanged from a year earlier. Breeding sheep totaled 48,000 head. Average value per head at \$228.00, was down \$18.00 from 2012. Total inventory value at \$12.5 million was 7 percent below the previous year.

Total **CHICKEN** inventory, excluding broilers, on December 1, 2012, at 34.3 million birds, was up 10 percent from last year. With this inventory, Indiana held on to third place in the nation for total chickens, excluding broilers, and moved to third position for layers (26.1 million). The total value of the chicken inventory was \$72.0 million, up 10 percent from 2011. The value per bird, at \$2.10 was unchanged from the previous year.
