Indiana June 1 Grain Stocks

On June 1, 2017, Indiana corn stocks totaled 299.9 million bushels, slightly lower than a year earlier, according to Greg Matli, State Statistician, of the USDA, NASS, Indiana Field Office. About 52 percent of the corn was stored on farms. The third quarter disappearance was 229.8 million bushels, compared with 184.1 million bushels a year earlier. Soybean stocks on June 1, 2017, were 78.1 million bushels. That was 34 percent higher than stocks a year earlier. The third quarter indicated disappearance was 62.2 million bushels, compared with 62.8 million bushels during the same period a year ago. Farm stocks of soybeans were 25.5 million bushels. Wheat stocks on June 1, 2017, were 27.7 million bushels, 36 percent above a year ago. Ninety-nine percent of all wheat stocks were in commercial storage. Fourth quarter indicated disappearance was 9.1 million bushels, 21 percent of supply.

U.S. corn stocks in all positions on June 1, 2017, totaled 5.23 billion bushels, up 11 percent from June 1, 2016. Of the total stocks, 2.84 billion bushels were stored on farms, up 15 percent from a year earlier. Off-farm stocks, 2.38 billion bushels, were up 6 percent from a year ago. The March – May 2017 indicated disappearance was 3.40 billion bushels, compared with 3.11 billion bushels during the same period last year. Soybeans stored in all positions on June 1, 2017, totaled 963 million bushels, up 11 percent from June 1, 2016. Soybean stocks stored on farms were estimated at 333 million bushels, up 18 percent from a year ago. Off-farm stocks, 631 million bushels, were up 7 percent from last June. Indicated disappearance for the March – May 2017 quarter totaled 775 million bushels, up 18 percent from the same period a year earlier. Old crop all wheat stored in all positions on June 1, 2017, totaled 1.18 billion bushels, up 21 percent from a year ago. On-farm stocks were estimated at 192 million bushels, down 3 percent from last June. Off-farm stocks, 993 million bushels, were up 28 percent from a year ago. The March – May 2017 indicated disappearance was 472 million bushels, up 19 percent from the same period a year earlier.
