KANSAS CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

MANHATTAN, Kan. July 2, 2018 - For the week ending July 1, 2018, there were 4.9 days suitable for fieldwork, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Topsoil moisture supplies rated 7 percent very short, 21 short, 68 adequate, and 4 surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies rated 10 percent very short, 28 short, 60 adequate, and 2 surplus.

Field Crops Report: Winter wheat condition rated 16 percent very poor, 30 poor, 37 fair, 15 good, and 2 excellent. Winter wheat mature was 97 percent, near 94 last year. Harvested was 71 percent, near 69 last year, and ahead of 63 for the five-year average.

Corn condition rated 4 percent very poor, 11 poor, 32 fair, 46 good, and 7 excellent. Corn silking was 30 percent, ahead of 17 last year and 19 average.

Soybean condition rated 1 percent very poor, 8 poor, 37 fair, 49 good, and 5 excellent. Soybeans emerged was 97 percent, near 94 last year, and ahead of 88 average. Blooming was 20 percent, ahead of 11 last year and 6 average.

Sorghum condition rated 2 percent very poor, 5 poor, 31 fair, 57 good, and 5 excellent. Sorghum headed was 5 percent, near 3 both last year and average.

Cotton condition rated 1 percent very poor, 4 poor, 29 fair, 61 good, and 5 excellent. Cotton squaring was 38 percent, well ahead of 8 last year and 11 average.

Sunflowers planted was 88 percent, near 92 last year, and equal to average.

Pasture and Range Report: Pasture and range conditions rated 6 percent very poor, 19 poor, 41 fair, 30 good, and 4 excellent.
