KANSAS CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

MANHATTAN, Kan. September 30, 2019 - For the week ending September 29, 2019, there were 5.7 days suitable for fieldwork, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Topsoil moisture supplies rated 6 percent very short, 23 short, 65 adequate, and 6 surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies rated 5 percent very short, 18 short, 73 adequate, and 4 surplus.

Field Crops Report: Winter wheat planted was 30 percent, behind 38 last year, and near 31 for the five-year average. Emerged was 12 percent, near 15 last year and 11 average.

Corn condition rated 4 percent very poor, 10 poor, 34 fair, 42 good, and 10 excellent. Corn dented was 96 percent, near 100 last year and 98 average. Mature was 73 percent, behind 89 last year and 84 average. Harvested was 28 percent, behind 45 last year and 41 average.

Soybean condition rated 3 percent very poor, 7 poor, 34 fair, 48 good, and 8 excellent. Soybeans dropping leaves was 44 percent, well behind 64 last year, and behind 59 average. Harvested was 2 percent, near 6 last year, and behind 7 average.

Sorghum condition rated 3 percent very poor, 8 poor, 27 fair, 51 good, and 11 excellent. Sorghum coloring was 92 percent, near 96 last year and 95 average. Mature was 38 percent, behind 47 last year and 49 average. Harvested was 6 percent, near 9 last year, and behind 11 average.

Cotton condition rated 3 percent very poor, 12 poor, 37 fair, 40 good, and 8 excellent. Cotton bolls opening was 46 percent, behind 62 last year, and near 48 average.

Sunflowers harvested was 3 percent, near 5 last year and 2 average.

Pasture and Range Report: Pasture and range conditions rated 2 percent very poor, 6 poor, 26 fair, 56 good, and 10 excellent.
