## KANSAS CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

**MANHATTAN, Kan. November 12, 2019** - For the week ending November 10, 2019, there were 6.6 days suitable for fieldwork, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Topsoil moisture supplies rated 8 percent very short, 32 short, 59 adequate, and 1 surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies rated 6 percent very short, 25 short, 67 adequate, and 2 surplus.

**Field Crops Report:** Winter wheat condition rated 4 percent very poor, 11 poor, 34 fair, 42 good, and 9 excellent. Winter wheat planted was 96 percent, ahead of 89 last year, and equal to the five-year average. Emerged was 79 percent, near 76 last year, but behind 84 average.

Corn harvested was 90 percent, near 88 last year and 94 average.

Soybeans harvested was 83 percent, ahead of 72 last year, but near 86 average.

Sorghum harvested was 84 percent, well ahead of 60 last year, and ahead of 75 average.

Cotton condition rated 2 percent very poor, 14 poor, 40 fair, 39 good, and 5 excellent. Cotton harvested was 26 percent, ahead of 17 last year, and equal to average.

Sunflowers harvested was 81 percent, well ahead of 61 last year, and ahead of 68 average.

**Pasture and Range Report:** Pasture and range conditions rated 3 percent very poor, 10 poor, 30 fair, 52 good, and 5 excellent.
