KANSAS CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

MANHATTAN, Kan. July 6, 2021 - For the week ending July 4, 2021, there were 4.5 days suitable for fieldwork, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Topsoil moisture supplies rated 3% very short, 17% short, 70% adequate, and 10% surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies rated 3% very short, 15% short, 76% adequate, and 6% surplus.

Field Crops Report: Winter wheat condition rated 3% very poor, 9% poor, 23% fair, 51% good, and 14% excellent. Winter wheat mature was 96%, near 97% last year and 95% for the five-year average. Harvested was 62%, behind 75% last year and 72% average.

Corn condition rated 1% very poor, 4% poor, 20% fair, 64% good, and 11% excellent. Corn silking was 18%, behind 24% last year and 27% average.

Soybean condition rated 1% very poor, 3% poor, 26% fair, 67% good, and 3% excellent. Soybeans emerged was 92%, behind 97% last year, and near 94% average. Blooming was 26%, near 27% last year, but ahead of 17% average.

Sorghum condition rated 1% very poor, 3% poor, 20% fair, 69% good, and 7% excellent. Sorghum planted was 98%, near 97% last year and 96% average. Headed was 1%, behind 6% both last year and average.

Cotton condition rated 2% very poor, 6% poor, 44% fair, 45% good, and 3% excellent. Cotton squaring was 42%, equal to last year, and ahead of 28% average.

Sunflowers planted was 93%, near 92% last year and 91% average.

Pasture and Range Report: Pasture and range conditions rated 1% very poor, 5% poor, 27% fair, 59% good, and 8% excellent.
