## KANSAS CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

**MANHATTAN, Kan. March 14, 2022** - For the week ending March 13, 2022, there were 4.3 days suitable for fieldwork, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Topsoil moisture supplies rated 39% very short, 33% short, 27% adequate, and 1% surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies rated 38% very short, 36% short, 25% adequate, and 1% surplus.

**Field Crops Report:** Winter wheat condition rated 13% very poor, 25% poor, 39% fair, 22% good, and 1% excellent.
