KANSAS CROP PROGRESS AND CONDITION

MANHATTAN, Kan. July 17, 2023 - For the week ending July 16, 2023, there were 5.3 days suitable for fieldwork, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Topsoil moisture supplies rated 10% very short, 24% short, 58% adequate, and 8% surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies rated 14% very short, 32% short, 52% adequate, and 2% surplus.

Field Crops Report: Winter wheat mature was 97%, near 100% for both last year and the five-year average. Harvested was 71%, well behind 98% last year and 94% average.

Corn condition rated 5% very poor, 9% poor, 32% fair, 44% good, and 10% excellent. Corn silking was 55%, ahead of 45% last year, and near 52% average. Dough was 13%, ahead of 8% last year, and equal to average.

Soybean condition rated 3% very poor, 8% poor, 31% fair, 49% good, and 9% excellent. Soybeans blooming was 46%, ahead of 34% last year, and near 42% average. Setting pods was 16%, ahead of 3% last year and 9% average.

Sorghum condition rated 3% very poor, 7% poor, 40% fair, 43% good, and 7% excellent. Sorghum planted was 96%, near 100% last year and 99% average. Headed was 12%, near 8% last year and 10% average. Coloring was 4%.

Cotton condition rated 5% very poor, 9% poor, 33% fair, 45% good, and 8% excellent. Cotton squaring was 72%, behind 81% last year, but near 68% average. Setting bolls was 12%, behind 20% last year, but near 10% average.

Sunflowers planted was 93%, near 96% both last year and average.

Pasture and Range Report: Pasture and range conditions rated 10% very poor, 18% poor, 38% fair, 31% good, and 3% excellent.
