### 2007 Cash Receipts

Cash receipts from 2007 farm marketings in Kansas were \$11.73 billion, up 13 percent from 2006. Livestock receipts increased 3 percent, accounting for 62 percent of all receipts. Crop receipts also increased, up 35 percent, accounting for the remaining 38 percent. Total direct government payments were down 20 percent for the year.

Gross income per Kansas farm, prior to inventory adjustment, increased 10 percent from 2006. Total production expenses increased 13 percent for the year. Net income per farm, after inventory adjustment, averaged \$33,789 in 2007, up \$15,459 from the year earlier. See detailed data in the accompanying tables.

\* Preliminary<sup>1</sup> Amounts include cash payments made directly to farmers, not including Farmer-owned Reserve Payments as these data are not available by State. Amounts also include certificate exchange gains and marketing loan gains.<sup>2</sup> Direct Payments and counter-cyclical payments are authorized by the Farm Security and Rural Investment Act of 2002 for 2002 through 2007 crops. The Act also increases the number of crops authorized to receive payments.<sup>3</sup> Programs authorized by the Farm Security and Rural Investment Act of 2002.<sup>4</sup> Payment includes both the CCC payments to quota holders and producers and the third party payments to quota holders and producers who opted for the lump sum payment option.<sup>5</sup> Conservation programs include Agricultural Conservation Program, Agricultural Management Assistance Program, Agricultural Management Assistance Program--NRCS, Auto Conservation Reserve Program--Cost Shares, Conservation Reserve Program--Annual Rental, Conservation Reserve Program--Cost Share, Conservation Reserve Program--Incentives, Conservation Security Program--NRCS, Environment Quality Incentives Program, Environment Quality Incentives Program--NRCS, EQIP--Ground and Surface Water Conservation--NRCS, EQIP--Klamath Basin--NRCS, EQIP-1996 Farm Bill--NRCS, Farmland Protection Program--NRCS, Forestry Conservation Reserve, Forestry Incentives Program--NRCS, Grasslands Reserve Program, Soil and Water Conservation Assistance Program, Wetlands Reserve Program--NRCS, Wetland Reserve Program, Wetlands Reserve Program--NRCS, and Wildlife Habitat Incentive Program--NRCS.<sup>6</sup> Ad Hoc and emergency programs include all programs providing disaster and emergency assistance payments to growers.
