## Kansas Agricultural Statistics

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### 2008 Cash Receipts Up 17 Percent

Cash receipts from 2008 farm marketings in Kansas were \$13.97 billion, up 17 percent from 2007. California led the nation in cash receipts in 2008, while Kansas ranked seventh at 4.3 percent of the U.S. total. Livestock receipts were virtually unchanged from the previous year but accounted for 52 percent of all receipts. Kansas ranked fifth in cash receipts from livestock and livestock products with 5.1 percent of the U.S. total and ranked third in cattle and calves, behind Nebraska and Texas. Crop receipts increased 43 percent and accounted for the remaining 48 percent of all receipts, making Kansas eighth in the nation. Kansas was the top state in sorghum cash receipts in 2008 with over 40 percent of the U.S. total and came in just behind North Dakota in wheat receipts to take second place with 13.9 percent of U.S. wheat receipts. Total direct government payments were up 25 percent for the year due to additional government funding for Ad Hoc and Emergency Funding.

Gross income per Kansas farm, prior to inventory adjustment, increased 17 percent from 2007. Total production expenses were virtually unchanged for the year. Net income per farm, after inventory adjustment, averaged \$56,239 in 2008, up \$30,327 from the year earlier. See detailed data in the accompanying tables.
