Kansas Crop Values Down 6 Percent

The value of 2011 field and miscellaneous crops was 7.3 billion dollars, down 6 percent from 2010. Soybeans and cotton were the only crops whose price decreased from last year at the State level, while all crops showed an increase at the National level.



