KANSAS DECEMBER 1, 2014 GRAIN AND HAY STOCKS

TOPEKA, KS, January 12, 2015 -- Kansas **corn** stocks in all positions on December 1, 2014 totaled 381 million bushels, up 14 percent from 2013, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Of the total, 130 million bushels are stored on farms, up 30 percent from a year ago. Off-farm stocks, at 251 million bushels, are up 8 percent from last year.

Wheat stored in all positions totaled 238 million bushels, down 8 percent from a year ago. On-farm stocks of 13.5 million bushels are up 17 percent from 2013 and off-farm stocks of 225 million bushels are down 9 percent from last year.

Sorghum stored in all positions totaled 156 million bushels, up 11 percent from last year. On-farm stocks of 17.0 million are up 21 percent and off farm holdings of 139 million are up 10 percent from last year

Soybeans stored in all positions totaled 105 million bushels, up 14 percent from last year. On-farm stocks of 24.0 million bushels are down 13 percent from a year ago, while off-farm stocks, at 81.4 million bushels, are up 25 percent from 2013.

Hay stocks on Kansas farms totaled 3.70 million tons on December 1, 2014, down 18 percent from a year earlier.

Grain storage capacity in Kansas totaled 1.42 billion bushels, up 35.0 million bushels from December 1, 2013. Total grain storage capacity is comprised of 380 million bushels of on-farm storage, unchanged from last year, and 1.03 billion bushels of off-farm storage, up 25.0 million bushels from 2013.
