KANSAS AGRICULTURAL PRICES

TOPEKA, KS, February 28, 2014 – The preliminary February price received by farmers for winter wheat averaged \$6.66 per bushel, an increase of 1 cent from the January price according to the USDA’s National Agricultural Statistics Service.

The preliminary February corn price, at \$4.48 per bushel, is up 5 cents from last month.

The preliminary February sorghum price averaged \$7.54 per cwt, an increase of 20 cents from January.

The preliminary February soybean price, at \$12.70 per bushel, is up 10 cents from last month.

The February alfalfa hay price, at \$171 per ton, is down from \$172 last month. The other hay price, at \$106 per ton, is down from \$107 last month.

The preliminary February sunflower price averaged \$22.30 per cwt, a decrease of 40 cents from January.
