## KANSAS AGRICULTURAL PRICES

TOPEKA, KS, May 30, 2014 – The preliminary May price received by farmers for winter wheat averaged \$7.61 per bushel, an increase of 26 cents from the April price according to the USDA’s National Agricultural Statistics Service.

The preliminary May corn price, at \$4.76 per bushel, is down 4 cents from last month.

The preliminary May sorghum price averaged \$8.08 per cwt, a decrease of 11 cents from April.

The preliminary May soybean price, at \$14.50 per bushel, is up 10 cents from last month.

The May alfalfa hay price, at \$189 per ton, is up \$26 from last month. The other hay price, at \$89 per ton, is down \$6 from last month.

The preliminary May sunflower price is withheld to avoid disclosing data for individual operations.
