KANSAS AGRICULTURAL PRICES

TOPEKA, KS, September 29, 2014 – The preliminary September price received by farmers for winter wheat averaged \$5.44 per bushel, a decrease of 63 cents from the August price according to the USDA’s National Agricultural Statistics Service.

The preliminary September corn price, at \$3.16 per bushel, is down 47 cents from last month.

The preliminary September sorghum price averaged \$5.46 per cwt, a decrease of 25 cents from August.

The preliminary September soybean price, at \$11.00 per bushel, is down \$2.10 from last month.

The September alfalfa hay price, at \$173 per ton, is down \$18 from August. The other hay price, at \$93 per ton, is down \$6 from last month.

The preliminary September sunflower price is withheld to avoid disclosing data for individual operations.
