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KANSAS CROP VALUES

TOPEKA, KS, February 24, 2016 – The value of Kansas’ 2015 **field and miscellaneous crops** is forecast at \$6.48 billion, according to the USDA’s National Agricultural Statistics Service. This is less than a 1 percent decrease from 2014.

The value of **corn** production is expected to total \$2.18 billion, up 2 percent from the previous marketing year. The Kansas corn price is projected to average \$3.75 per bushel, a decrease of \$0.03 from the last marketing year.

The value of **winter wheat** production is expected to total \$1.56 billion, up 4 percent from the previous marketing year. Kansas’ winter wheat price is projected to average \$4.85 per bushel, a decrease of \$1.22 from the last marketing year.
