KANSAS HOG INVENTORY UNCHANGED

TOPEKA, KS, September 26, 2014 -- **Kansas inventory** of all hogs and pigs on September 1, 2014, was 1.82 million head, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. This was unchanged from September 1, 2013, but up 11 percent from June 1, 2014.

Breeding hog inventory, at 170,000 head, was unchanged from both September 1, 2013, and last quarter. **Market hog inventory**, at 1.65 million head, was unchanged from last year, but up 12 percent from last quarter.

The June - August 2014 Kansas pig crop, at 832,000 head, was up 2 percent from 2013. Sows farrowed during the period totaled 84,000 head, up 4 percent from last year. The average pigs saved per litter was 9.90 for the June – August period, compared to 10.05 last year.

Kansas hog producers intend to farrow 83,000 sows during the September – November 2014 quarter, up 4 percent from the actual farrowings during the same period a year ago. Intended farrowings for December 2014 – February 2015 are 83,000 sows, up 4 percent from the actual farrowings during the same period the previous year.
