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Kansas Cattle on Feed

The number of **cattle on feed** on June 1, 2009 in Kansas feedlots with 1,000 head or more capacity totaled 2.08 million head, down 5 percent from a year ago and down 5 percent from May 1, 2009. **Placements** during May totaled 345,000 head, down 16 percent from a year ago but 5 percent above April 2009 placements of 330,000 head. **Marketings** during May totaled 425,000 head, 13 percent below May 2008 but 4 percent above April 2009. **Other disappearance** was 20,000 head, unchanged from a year ago and unchanged from the previous month. The percent of May placements by weight was: under 600 pounds, 19 percent; 600-699 pounds, 20 percent; 700-799 pounds, 32 percent; and 800 pounds or heavier, 29 percent.

U.S. Cattle on Feed

Cattle and calves on feed for slaughter market in the United States in feedlots with capacity of 1,000 or more head totaled 10.41 million head on June 1, 2009. The inventory was down 4 percent from June 1, 2008. **Placements** in feedlots during May totaled 1.64 million, 14 percent below 2008. Net placements were 1.54 million. During May, placements of cattle and calves weighing less than 600 pounds were 395,000; 600-699 pounds were 305,000; 700-799 pounds were 433,000; and 800 pounds and greater were 505,000. **Marketings** of fed cattle during May totaled 1.95 million, 9 percent below 2008. This is the lowest fed cattle marketings for the month of May since the series began in 1996. **Other disappearance** totaled 101,000 during May, 26 percent above 2008.

Kansas Cattle and Milk: Production, Disposition, and Income

The gross income from **cattle** in Kansas totaled 6.25 billion dollars in 2008, down 1 percent from 2007. Cash receipts from marketings of cattle and calves decreased 1 percent from \$6.3 billion in 2007 to \$6.2 billion in 2008. All cattle and calf marketings totaled 6.7 billion pounds in 2008, down 1 percent from 2007. The value of **milk** produced in Kansas totaled 456.4 million dollars in 2008, up 8 percent from 2007. Average returns per hundredweight totaled \$18.90, down 40 cents from 2007.
