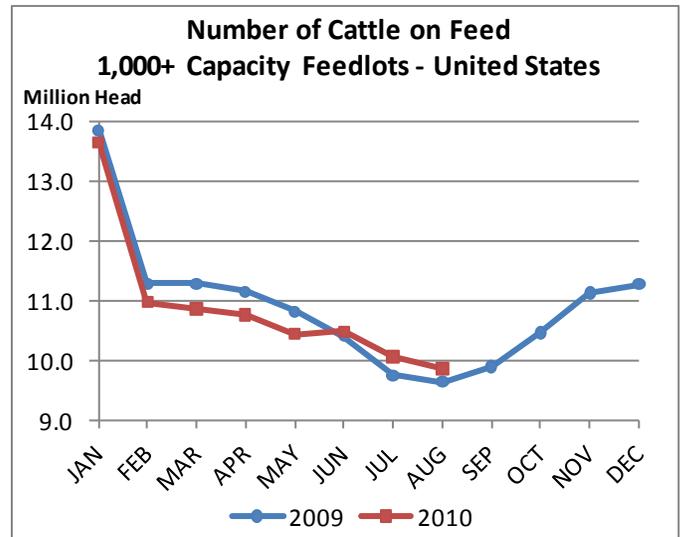
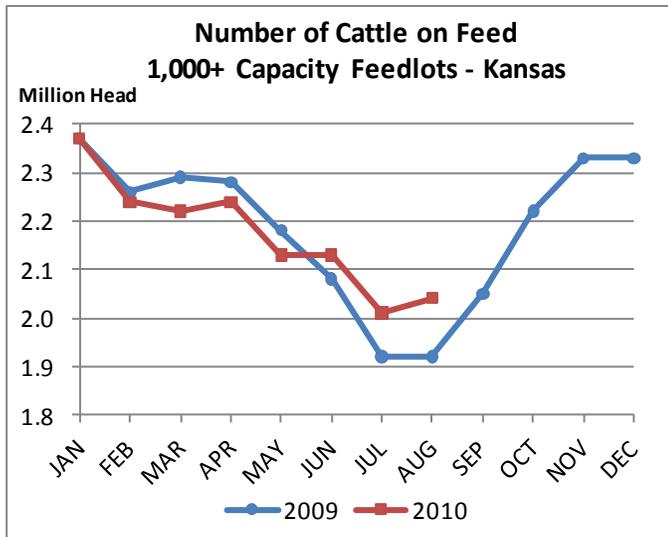
Kansas Cattle on Feed

The number of **cattle on feed** on August 1, 2010 in Kansas feedlots with 1,000 head or more capacity totaled 2.04 million head, up 6 percent from a year ago and up 1 percent from July 1, 2010. **Placements** during July totaled 500,000 head, up 4 percent from a year ago and up 37 percent from June 2010 placements of 365,000 head. **Marketings** during July totaled 460,000 head, down 2 percent from July 2009 and down 3 percent from June 2010. **Other disappearance** was 10,000 head, unchanged from both a year ago and the previous month. The percent of July placements by weight was: under 600 pounds, 15 percent; 600-699 pounds, 18 percent; 700-799 pounds, 33 percent; and 800 pounds or heavier, 34 percent.

U.S. Cattle on Feed

Cattle and calves on feed for slaughter market in the United States for feedlots with capacity of 1,000 or more head totaled 9.9 million head on August 1, 2010. The inventory was 2 percent above August 1, 2009. **Placements** in feedlots during July totaled 1.75 million, 6 percent below 2009. Net placements were 1.71 million head. During July, placements of cattle and calves weighing less than 600 pounds were 415,000, 600-699 pounds were 305,000, 700-799 pounds were 449,000, and 800 pounds and greater were 585,000. **Marketings** of fed cattle during July totaled 1.90 million, 2 percent below 2009. This is the lowest fed cattle marketings for the month of July since the series began in 1996. **Other disappearance** totaled 48,000 during July, 12 percent above 2009.

U.S. Canadian Cattle Inventory Down 2 Percent

All cattle and calves in the U. S. and Canada combined totaled 114.8 million head on July 1, 2010, down 2 percent from a year ago. All cows and heifers that have calved, at 46.1 million head, were down 2 percent from a year ago.

All cattle and calves in the United States as of July 1, 2010, totaled 100.8 million head, 1 percent below the 102.0 million head on July 1, 2009. All cows and heifers that have calved, at 40.8 million head, were down 1 percent from a year ago.

All cattle and calves in Canada as of July 1, 2010, totaled 14.0 million head, down 5 percent from the 14.7 million on July 1, 2009. All cows and heifers that have calved, at 5.34 million, were down 4 percent from the 5.57 million on July 1, 2009.

Kansas Milk Production Up 2.5 Percent and U.S. Up 3.0 Percent

The July 2010 **milk production in Kansas** totaled 208 million pounds, up less than 1 percent from June 2010 and up 2.5 percent from July 2009. The **production per cow** averaged 1,750 pounds, down 5 pounds from June 2010 but up 15 pounds from July 2009. The **number of milk cows** was estimated at 119,000 head, up 1,000 head from June 2010 and up 2,000 head from the previous year.

Milk production in the 23 major States during July totaled 15.3 billion pounds, up 3.0 percent from July 2009. June production, revised at 15.2 billion pounds, was up 2.9 percent from June 2009. **Production per cow** in the 23 major States averaged 1,830 pounds for July, 59 pounds above July 2009. The **number of milk cows** on farms in the 23 major States was 8.37 million head, 26,000 head below July 2009, but 19,000 head above June 2010.
