Kansas Cattle on Feed

The number of **cattle on feed** on August 1, 2011 in Kansas feedlots with 1,000 head or more capacity totaled 2.18 million head, up 7 percent from both a year ago and July 1, 2011. **Placements** during July totaled 580,000 head, up 16 percent from a year ago and up 49 percent from June 2011 placements of 390,000 head. This is the largest placements since August 2010 and the largest July placements since 2006. **Marketings**

during July totaled 420,000 head, down 9 percent from both July 2010 and June 2011. This is the lowest July marketings since the series began in 1996. **Other disappearance** was 10,000 head, unchanged from both a year ago and the previous month. The percent of July placements by weight was: under 600 pounds, 16 percent; 600-699 pounds, 20 percent; 700-799 pounds, 33 percent; and 800 pounds or heavier, 31 percent.

U.S. Cattle on Feed

Cattle and calves on feed for slaughter market in the United States for feedlots with capacity of 1,000 or more head totaled 10.6 million head on August 1, 2011. The inventory was 8 percent above August 1, 2010. This is the third highest August 1 inventory since the series began in 1996. **Placements** in feedlots during July totaled 2.15 million, 22 percent above 2010. This is the highest placement total for the month of July since the series began in 1996. Net placements were 2.09

million head. During July, placements of cattle and calves weighing less than 600 pounds were 625,000, 600-699 pounds were 405,000, 700-799 pounds were 498,000, and 800 pounds and greater were 625,000. **Marketings** of fed cattle during July totaled 1.91 million, slightly above 2010. This is the second lowest fed cattle marketings for the month of July since the series began in 1996. **Other disappearance** totaled 67,000 during July, 40 percent above 2010.

Kansas Milk Production Up 3.8 Percent and U.S. Up 0.8 Percent

The July 2011 **milk production in Kansas** totaled 219 million pounds, up 0.9 percent from June 2011 and up 3.8 percent from July 2010. The **production per cow** averaged 1,765 pounds, unchanged from June 2011 but up 5 pounds from July 2010. The **number of milk cows** was estimated at 124,000 head, up 1,000 head from June 2011 and up 4,000 head from the previous year.

Milk production in the 23 major States during July totaled 15.4 billion pounds, up 0.8 percent from July 2010. June production, revised at 15.4 billion pounds, was up 1.3 percent from June 2010. **Production per cow** in the 23 major States averaged 1,824 pounds for July, 5 pounds below July 2010. The **number of milk cows** on farms in the 23 major States was 8.47 million head, 93,000 head more July 2010, and 8,000 head more than June 2011.
