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Kansas Cattle on Feed

The number of **cattle on feed** on July 1, 2011 in Kansas feedlots with 1,000 head or more capacity totaled 2.03 million head, up 1 percent from a year ago but down 4 percent from June 1. **Placements** during June totaled 390,000 head, up 7 percent from June 2010 and up 4 percent from May. **Marketings** during June totaled 460,000 head, down 3 percent from June 2010 but

up 10 percent from May. **Other disappearance** was 10,000 head, unchanged from last year but down 33 percent from the previous month. The percent of June placements by weight was: under 600 pounds, 19 percent; 600-699 pounds, 24 percent; 700-799 pounds, 31 percent; and 800 pounds or heavier, 26 percent.

U.S. Cattle on Feed

Cattle and calves on feed for slaughter market in the United States for feedlots with capacity of 1,000 or more head totaled 10.5 million head on July 1, 2011. The inventory was 4 percent above July 1, 2010. The inventory included 6.52 million steers and steer calves, up 4 percent from the previous year. This group accounted for 62 percent of the total inventory. Heifers and heifer calves accounted for 3.89 million head, up 3 percent from 2010.

Placements in feedlots during June totaled 1.70 million, 4 percent above 2010. Net placements were 1.63 million head. During June, placements of cattle and calves weighing less than 600 pounds were 460,000, 600-699 pounds were 380,000, 700-799 pounds were 420,000, and 800 pounds and greater were 435,000. **Marketings** of fed cattle during June totaled 2.10 million, 5 percent above 2010. **Other disappearance** totaled 70,000 during June, 27 percent above 2010.

Kansas Milk Production Up 4.8 Percent and U.S. Up 1.4 Percent

The June 2011 **milk production in Kansas** totaled 217 million pounds, down 4.0 percent from the May production of 226 million pounds, but up 4.8 percent from June 2010. The **production per cow** averaged 1,765 pounds, down 105 pounds from May but up 10 pounds from June 2010. The **number of milk cows** was estimated at 123,000 head, up 2,000 from May and up 5,000 head from the previous year.

Milk production in the 23 major States during June totaled 15.4 billion pounds, up 1.4 percent from June 2010.

May revised production at 16.1 billion pounds, was up 1.6 percent from May 2010. The May revision represented an increase of 20 million pounds or 0.1 percent from last month's preliminary production estimate. **Production per cow** in the 23 major States averaged 1,819 pounds for June, 2 pounds above June 2010. The **number of milk cows** on farms in the 23 major States was 8.46 million head, 106,000 head more than June 2010, and 11,000 head more than May 2011.

July 1 Cattle Inventory Down 1 Percent

All cattle and calves in the United States as of July 1, 2011, totaled 100.0 million head, 1 percent below the 101.1 million on July 1, 2010. **All cows and heifers** that have calved, at 40.6 million, were down 1 percent from July 1, 2010. **Beef cows**, at 31.4 million, were down 1 percent from July 1, 2010. **Milk cows**, at 9.2 million, were up 1 percent from July 1, 2010. Other class estimates on July 1, 2011 and the changes from July 1, 2010, are as follows: **All heifers** 500 pounds and over, 16.0 million,

down 1 percent. **Beef replacement heifers**, 4.2 million, down 5 percent. **Milk replacement heifers**, 4.2 million, up 4 percent. **Other heifers**, 7.6 million, down 2 percent. **Steers** weighing 500 pounds and over, 14.2 million, down 1 percent. **Bulls** weighing 500 pounds and over, 2.0 million, down 5 percent. **Calves under 500 pounds**, 27.2 million, down 1 percent. **All cattle and calves on feed for slaughter**, 12.2 million, up 3 percent.
