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### Kansas Cattle on Feed

The number of **cattle on feed** on May 1, 2011 in Kansas feedlots with 1,000 head or more capacity totaled 2.17 million head, up 2 percent from a year ago but down 1 percent from April 1. **Placements** during April totaled 380,000 head, up 21 percent from April 2010 but down 8 percent from March. This is the highest April placements since 2003. **Marketings** during April totaled 385,000 head, down 5 percent from April 2010 and down 11

percent from March. This is the lowest April marketings since 1995. **Other disappearance** was 15,000 head, down 5,000 head from a year ago but 5,000 head above the previous month. The percent of April placements by weight was: under 600 pounds, 16 percent; 600-699 pounds, 16 percent; 700-799 pounds, 34 percent; and 800 pounds or heavier, 34 percent.

### U.S. Cattle on Feed

**Cattle and calves on feed** for slaughter market in the United States for feedlots with capacity of 1,000 or more head totaled 11.2 million head on May 1, 2011. The inventory was 7 percent above May 1, 2010. **Placements** in feedlots during April totaled 1.80 million, 10 percent above 2010. This is the second highest placements for the month of April since the series began in 1996. Net placements were 1.74 million head. During April,

placements of cattle and calves weighing less than 600 pounds were 450,000, 600-699 pounds were 310,000, 700-799 pounds were 490,000, and 800 pounds and greater were 545,000. **Marketings** of fed cattle during April totaled 1.81 million, 3 percent below 2010. **Other disappearance** totaled 59,000 during April, 35 percent below 2010. This is the lowest other disappearance for the month of April since the series began in 1996.

### Kansas Cattle and Milk: 2010 Production, Disposition, and Income

The gross income from **cattle** in Kansas totaled \$6.55 billion in 2010, up 18 percent from 2009. Cash receipts from marketings of cattle and calves increased 18 percent from \$5.55 billion in 2009 to \$6.53 billion in 2010. All cattle and calf marketings totaled 6.78 billion pounds in 2010, up

3 percent from 2009. The value of **milk** produced in Kansas totaled \$432.3 million in 2010, up 24 percent from 2009. Average returns per hundredweight totaled \$17.30, up \$3.30 from 2009.

### Kansas Milk Production Up 3.3 Percent and U.S. Up 1.7 Percent

The April 2011 **milk production in Kansas** totaled 216 million pounds, down 3.1 percent from the March production of 223 million pounds, but up 3.3 percent from April 2010. The **production per cow** averaged 1,785 pounds, down 60 pounds from March and down 20 pounds from April 2010. The **number of milk cows** was estimated at 121,000 head, unchanged from March but up 5,000 head from the previous year.

**Milk production** in the 23 major States during April totaled 15.5 billion pounds, up 1.7 percent from April 2010. March

revised production at 15.8 billion pounds, was up 2.4 percent from March 2010. The March revision represented a decrease of 6 million pounds or less than 0.1 percent from last month's preliminary production estimate. **Production per cow** in the 23 major States averaged 1,834 pounds for April, 9 pounds above April 2010. **The number of milk cows** on farms in the 23 major States was 8.43 million head, 97,000 head more than April 2010, and 8,000 head more March 2011.
